September in the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred & Twenty I Joseph
Baker of Doulthorpe parish in the County of York aforesaid being sick and
weak in body but of good & perfect memory thankes be to Almighty God & calling
to remembraunce the uncertain Estate of this transitory Life & that all flesh
must yield unto death when it shall please God to call me make Constitute &
declare this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following reciting
& annulling by these presents all & every Testament & Testaments wills
heretofore by me made & declared either by word or by writing & this to be taken
only for my last Will & Testament and none other, And first being
penitent & sorry from the bottom of my heart for my sins past moste
desirous forgiveness for the same, I give & Connyt my soul unto Almighty
God my Saviour & Redemer in whom & by the Merites of Jesus Christ
I trust & believe assuredly to be saved & to have full remission & forgive[n]ce

of all my Sins and that my Soul with my Body at the Agemall day of
the Resurrection shall arise again with joy and through the merits of Christ
Death & Sarcophagus & inherit the Kingdom of Heaven prepared for us
Deat & Corpse & my Body to be buried in such decent & Christian manner
as to the direction of my Executors hereafter named shall seem meet &
conuenient & now for the settling of my Immortal Estate & such Goods
Chattels & Debts as it bath pleased God far above my deserts to bestow uppon
me I do order give & deuise the same in manner & form following that is to
say first I will that all those Debts & Dutys as I owe in right or
Conscience to any maner of person or persons whatsoever shall be well &

or value thereof to be paid unto her in hand Item I give & bequeath
unto my Sister Ann White the sum of just sum of Twenty thousand pounds
of good Merchantable vire to be kept on the proper account & vire of her

and her Husband Richard White living in London in hogsheads of Seven hundred & fifty or eight hundred weight and consigned to whom they shall appoint which to be my will & desire is shall be in full satisfaction of what goods & effects I have of mine in my hands at this time which to tobacco my will & desire is shall be shipped them as soon as conveniently may or can but within three years after my decease as farthest to the use of them the said Richard & Anne his wife their heirs & assigns for ever. I also give & bequeath unto my Sister Anne and her Husband Richard White all the money & effects they have in their hands of mine to them & their heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth Hart the sum & just sum of Twenty Thousand pounds of good merchantable Tobacco to be shott on her charges account & risque in hogsheads of Seven hundred & fifty or eight hundred weight & consigned to whom she shall appoint which to my will & desire is shall be shott unto her as soon as conveniently may or can but within three years after my decease as farthest and my will & desire is that a true & just copy of this my will be read & transmuted unto both my said Sisters by the first opportunity after my decease my & Sister Anne living in one Lane in west Smithfield London wth Richard White a Coach maker and my Sister Elizabeth living wth him. Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Hatwood his wife & assigns for ever my man called Tom to be delivered unto his guardian or Trustees in trust for him until he comes of age and also my negro w^m called Cuffe & his wife & his heirs for ever to be delivered him or his in trust for him after my wife's decease. Item I give & bequeath unto W^m Hatwood two Pounds & 10 Shillings my intent & meaning is that the son of John Hatwood deceased. Item I give & bequeath unto John Ferguson one gold Ring of the Value & Cost of Twenty Shillings Item I give & bequeath unto Henry Hatwood one new Suit of Cloth wth leather. Item I give & bequeath unto James Hatwood my son in Law all the Land & Chattels I bought of Thomas Weller to him & his wife & assigns for ever yet so as we shall not distract molest or entombed his mother from having & attorney any part or parcel of the same Land during the Term of her natural life. Item I give & bequeath unto all the rest of my wife's children not herein before mentioned and to each of them a Gold Ring of the Value & Cost of Twenty Shillings. Item I give & bequeath unto Thomas Bell one half of the Tobacco he now justly standeth indebted unto me to him & his wife for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto

Anthony North my last Dint of warcing apparell to him & his heirs &c
Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife all the roft residue & remains
