 constitute & ordain this my last will & Testament in manner & form follow-
 ing, that is to say, I give & bequeath my soul to God who gave it, hoping
 thro the Merits & Mediation of my blessed Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ, to
 obtain a joyful resurrection at the last day, and my body to be buried to be
 decently buried, and as to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow
 upon me I dispose of as followeth Viz I give & bequeath to my dear &
 loving wife Mary Tenant & Land & plantation whereon I now dwell contain-
 ing one hundred acres together with all & appurtenances therunto belong-
 ing, including all other Viz I am. winner. freely & fringes and all other my
 personal Estate which I have on, & belonging to my said plantation (except
 the Cargo of Goods which I have in my Store and my outstanding Debt) to
 her & her heirs for ever, in Case she shall think fit to marry, of the same in
 full satisfaction of her legal share and to the third part of my Estate and for as
 much as there may happen a dispute touching the title of & said Land, I
 farther give & bequeath unto my said wife, fifty pounds Sterling, and the
 Debt with her father Robert Brooks freely owes me, the better to enable her
 to make & do all good, from my other plantation & Land containing three
 hundred acres lying near & Range I leave to be sold, and the produce thereof

Item Whereas I have been trading wth M^r James Harris attorney
for M^r George Warner Worth. In London for & purchase of a tract of
Land called & Grove containing sixteen hundred acres lying in Cecil County
in the province of Maryland, at & Mouth of Sassafras River together wth
& three & a half Negroes. at & price of six hundred pounds Sterling, I do
hereby order & empower my & executor, to buy & purchase of & at
Paul Negro & Son, in & name & for use of my Son Edward, and his heirs for
ever, and to pay for it out of my Estate, and in Case & at Harris or Warner should justify
upon a greater price my will is that my Ex^r advance to seven hundred pounds
Sterling but no farther. Item I give & bequeath to my said Son three Negroes
& viz^t Will. Durance & Sarah. to be sent to & plantation on & at Land called &
Grove after a purchase thereof that he made at aforesd. Item my will & desire is
that not any of my Estate may be appraised, but that my Ex^r return a just In-
ventory thereof, and get in my Debts as soon as they can, and sell & dispose of Goods
in & Debts for money, and that after my just Debts are satisfied, and & Groves paid
for as aforesd the remaining part of my Estate be equally divided between my two
Daughters, Mary and — and paid to them when they come to & age of eighteen
years or day of Marriage, Item in case it should happen that & at tract of Land
called & Grove cannot be purchased for & use of my Son as aforesd. then I give &
bequeath unto my & Son, that three hundred acres of Land before ordered to
be sold together wth & three Negroes and the Debt thereon to him & his heirs
for ever, and likewise two hundred pounds Sterling to be paid him when he
comes to & age of twenty & one years and & remaining part of my Estate to be
equally divided between my Daughters as aforesd. Item my will & desire is
that my dear & loving wife & I raise & maintain my Son during his
widowhood, and the use of his Interest for his maintenance & Education,
but that after my death my Ex^r take my Son and his Interest into
their hands, Item I give & bequeath unto my & my friends Paul Maboo &
William Wyshaw all my books, Saffly & Constitutors appoint my Ex^r &
well beloved friends, M^r Paul Maboo, and M^r William Wyshaw, my
