November one thousand seven hundred and nineteen, I Richard Goode of
the County of Essex, being very sick and weak, but in perfect sense &
memory, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner
and form as followeth, first I commend my Soul to almighty God that gave
it me and my body to be disposed according to the order & Discretion of
my Ex^{rs} hereinafter named, in hopes of a joyfull Resurrection to life
eternal at the last day through our Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ. And
as for my worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I
give and bequeath as follows. I give and bequeath all my Land
& Plantation to my son John Goode & his heirs for ever, and all my
wearing apparell I give unto my son Richard Goode, Item I give &
bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Goode the one half of all my
personall estate, and the other half of my personall estate five and
bequeath to be equally divided between my two daughters Sarah Gray
& Margaret Harmer after my just Debts paid, and funeral Charges,
and lastly I constitute and appoint my son ^{John} Goode and my beloved
wife Mary Goode Ex^{rs} of this my very Last Will & Testament, Revocable
and annulling all and every other Will or Wills by me made or had made
heretofore. In Testimony whereof I hereunto put my hand & affix my
Seal this 30. day of Novr above written -
