appoint this my last will and Testament, Item I give & bequeath
to my son Richard Hobson one half and half wife & land to my wife
beloved wife Margaret Hobson son part of my estate during her life, Item
I give and bequeath to my daughter Alice Duddin all my cattle and
Sole Estate moveables and immovables her uses Ex: Adm' & Co. for ever
and likewise my estate and ordain she & the said Hobson to be Executors of
