St Ann do aount thus my last will I do give to my son
James and to my son Mark that scat of Land where they
now live to be equally divided betwixt them I do give
it to them and their heirs for ever the one half of that
Land where I now live I do give it to my son Boniamus
I do give it to him and his heirs for ever the other half
of that Land where I now live I do give it to my son John
and my son William I do give it to them and their
heirs for ever my will is that my two Daughters Mary
and grace have privilege to Live and work on my
Land whill they are single as much as it were their own
and I do give that scat of Land which I bought of warick
gray to my son John and my son William to be equally
divided betwixt them I do give it to them and their heirs
for ever as for the rest of my Estat my will is that of
my Children which are at home with me and have
nothing that each of them have as much as any of
them that are gone from me in household that which I
have provided for them and the rest of my Estat I leave
in the hands of my wife during her widow hood if she
continue so to the day of her death then to divide it
equally as she can among my Children with the dowry
and Consent of my two eldest sons James and Mark but
if my wife marry then my will is that my three eldest
sons James Mark and Boniamus take what she is
and divide it equally dividing all my Children my will is
that
