In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Writin being sick &
weak of body but in perfect sense & memory do make this my last will & testament
and first of gives my Soul to God & my Body to the Earth to be buried accord-
ing to the direction of my life in some certain barge of ordinary life
through the merits of my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whom I believe to be
now sitting at the right hand of God in heaven making intercession for me, as for
my worldly good I give & bequeath as follows vizt 1st I give to my son
John Coffins what I have already given him five pounds & ten hundred acres of Land
q^o which he now liveth on and the negroes he is now possess with to him & to his
heirs lawfully begotten by him, 2^{ly} I give to my son Thomas my plantation I
now live on and as much more land as will make the same to contain two hundred
and fifty acres joining to the said plantation & three negroes w^{ch} is by name Sally
& Tom & little Moll and two feather beds and furniture, 3^{ly} I give to my
son Robert two negro's by name Jast & old Moll & one feather bed & furniture
4^{ly} I give to my son the two negroes q^o one named Flossie now in being &
other is to be bought by my son wth money that is now in the hands of Mr
Wills Shorthill 5^{ly} I give to my Daughter Winsford four thousand pounds of
Tobacco or a negro but not to be paid to her till the first & twentieth day of
December in the year 1721 6^{ly} I give to my Daughter Audridge four
thousand pounds of Tobacco or a negro but not to be paid to her till the first &
twentieth day of December in the year 1723 - 8^{ly} I give to my Daughter Ann
Stevens & to her heirs lawfully begotten of body one negro girl named Sarah
w^{ch} is to negro she now hath in possession q^o I will that my three youngest sons
Thomas & Robert & die shall not have their negro's delivered to them till they
arrive to the age of twenty years & in case either of them should die without
an heir lawfully begotten by them that then their estates be equally divided
amongst the surviving brothers and sisters except my son John who is not to
comes in for any part thereof to ly I will that all the rest of my estate
be equally divided amongst all my children after my debts & funeral
charges be paid except my Daughter Ann who hath had her part of my estate
paid away the rest being to divide their parts as they come to age or
dye. I will that whereas I have made provision for building of a Mill and
millponds and for works for the same that my Executor go forward wth
it & make the same to be built and after my son Thomas comes to the age
of twenty I will that he profit and enjoy the same to his own use
and for his family support of this and my other children dye out
as he the law allows him to fall back into the hands of his posterity

• Their own proper State; Lastly I do ordain & appoint my two Sons
John & Thomas jointly as Successors to be my Executors to see this my will
fulfilled according to the true intent & meaning thereof and so witnesses at
their will & witness I do with my own hand seal and sign this as
my last will & Testament in the sight and presence of these persons
whose names are hereunto subscribed the day & year first above written
on the other side —

& therefore given to almighty God do make & ordain this my present last will &
Testament in manner & form following that is to say first & principally I
commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through his merits
Death & passion of my Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ to be made a partaker of
of ever lasting joys of immortality at the joyfull resurrection, and my body I
trust to the Earth to be dersotly interred at the direction of my Executors here-
after named and as touching the disposall of such Temporal Estate as it shall
please God to bestow on me I do order give & bequeath & dispose the same
in manner & form following - First I will that my Legal Debts be all
paid & satisfied. Item I give unto my son Lawrence the plantation he now
hath together with the said slaves belonging to him & his heirs for ever also three
negro's named Sam & Tom and Dick now in his possession. Item I give unto my
son John the plantation whereon he now liveth together with the said slaves belonging
to him & his heirs for ever also two negro's namely French & ~~Sam~~ now being
in his possession, and likewise other slaves both men & women, for me to give unto
my daughter Mary a ring of rubies, Sapphires & diamonds, also to give unto my
Daughter Elizabeth a ring of diamonds & gold. Also to give a part
of the said plantation to my son John, also to give unto my son John
