In the Name of God Amen / Thomas Mountague  
of Epes County & parish in the Colony of Virginia being sick & weak in  
body, but of sound and perfect memory make this my last will & testament  
knowing the uncertainty of this present life on Earth and being desirous to set  
things in order to the uttmost of my power & duty, I do make this my last Will &  
Testament in manner & form following viz: First and principally I command  
my Soul to Almighty God my Creator; steadfastly believing that I shall receive full  
pardon and remission of all my Sins and be saved by the precious death & crucifixion  
of my Beloved Saviour & Deliverer Jesus Christ; and my body from whence it  
was taken to be buried in such decent & Christian manner as to my Execs. were  
after named shall then be most convenient: and as concerning my worldly estate  
as the Lord in mercy hath sent me; my will & meaning is that the same shall  
be employ'd as hereafter by this my last Will & Testament is except first I do  
revoke frustrate & make void all wills by me formerly made; and declare  
this to be my last Will & Testament in manner and form following. I give & bequeath unto my Chz: Wm Mountague the Son of my Loving Bz: w/  
Wm Mountague all that tract or parcel of Land call Mountagues Island  
with all its appurtenances belonging thereto; to him & his heirs for ever.  
Item I give and bequeath unto Thomas Fair of Middlesex County; and to his  
heirs for ever One hundred and fifty acres of Land to be taken out of the  
upper side of my Land lying in Epes County; and one negro man call'd  
Harry; Item I give unto my dear and loving wife one negro girl call'd Kays.  
One negro girl call'd Frank; one negro boy call'd Jack; one negro boy call'd  
Samson to her & her heirs for ever. Item I give unto Thomas Fair his heir  
of Chz: Item I give to Wm Young my son in Law my Set of Chz: bind  
with Silver; Item I give to my Daughter in Law Edz: Young one mare call'd  
Magget; Item I give unto my Loving brother Wm Mountague all the re-  
mainning part of my wearing Chz: Item I leave to my loving wife Katherin

Mountague the remains of that tract of Land of mine in Esq; during her life  
 But if in case she is with Child; and delivery of other male or female, then in this  
 Case to be hers and her heirs for ever with all the remaining part of my negroes  
 & cattle heretofore stay'd. But if without Issue then the remaining part of my negroes  
 I give to my loving Esq<sup>r</sup> Wm Mountague with the above mentioned tract of land  
 which Tract of Land he is to take possession of at the death of my loving  
 wife M<sup>r</sup> Mountague. How I leave to my loving Brother W<sup>m</sup> Mountague  
 my son James and before he may have two years Loring. How it is my will  
 and pleasure that in failure of all heirs, the remains of my estate be equally  
 divided between my dear and loving wife Katherine Mountague & my Esq<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Mountague  
 Lastly I constitute & appoint my dear and loving wife Katherine  
 Mountague, my loving brother W<sup>m</sup> Mountague and my Esq<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Mountague  
 Executors of this my last will & Testament as witness my hand Seal this  
 7<sup>th</sup> day of February 1720 and in year of our sovereign Lord George King  
 of England Scotland France & Ireland Defender of the faiths.
