this life do make this my last will & Testament in writing my Son
to almighty God that gave it and my duty to the Lord for whom it was

taken, to be buried in a Christian like manner in full assurance of the resurrection
 at the day, As to my worldly estate w^{ch} I have I give & dispose of as followeth
 first I give to my dearest son William fifty acres of Land adjoining to my plantation
 where he now lives, and after the death to his dearest son William and his heirs
 for ever. Item I give to my son Benjamin fifty acres of Land adjoining to the
 plantation where he now lives, and also all the Land I have of that piece of ground
 next to John Pitts, to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give to my son Henry
 fifty acres of Land lying next to my son Benjamin to him and his heirs for ever
 Item I give to my son John fifty acres of Land lying next to my son Henry and
 to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give all the remaining part of my Land to my
 son Charles & Boozley to him and his heirs for ever. Item I give unto my loving wife
 Mary Boozley, all my personal estate both within doors & out to be at her disposal
 as she shall think fit Lastly I constitute ordain & appoint my loving wife Mary
 Boozley Executor of this my Last will & Testament revoking & annulling all
 other wills by me formerly made, and declaring & pronouncing this to be my last
 In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty first day
 of January 1714
