



Item I give and bequeath to my son Jeremiah Uffshaw the plantation that I now live on three hundred & fifty acres of the lower part of the Tract to be & his heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my son Edward Uffshaw all the smaller part to him & his heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my son William Uffshaw all my Quarter Land lying in the Fork of Johnsons Swamp to him & his heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my son John Uffshaw my plantation in Glaston to him & his heirs for ever

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Esther Hopkins three pounds paid in a Store

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Brookings twenty five Shillings paid in a Store

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Uffshaw during her life three pounds a year Rent in a Store

Item I give & constitute all the rest of my Estate to be Equally divided between my loving wife & the Children that I do by her which are my wife Anne Uffshaw Hannah Uffshaw my daughter Esmerine & William Uffshaw & have hereunto set my hand &
