Be it remembered In the name of God Amen this Nineteen day of December
 1708 the one thousand seven hundred Eighteen and in the fifth
 year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King George of
 great Britain France & Ireland King Defender of the faith
 I William Young of the County of Hampshire parson
 in the County of Virginia being sick & weak in body but
 of sound and perfect memory praise be given unto All-
 mighty God for the same, and knowing the uncertainty
 of this present life on Earth and being desirous
 to do something in order to make this my Last will
 and Testament in manner and form following
 VIZ that is to say first and principally I commended
 my soul to Almighty God my Creator assuredly
 believing that I shall receive full pardon for in-
 fractions of all my sins, and be saved by the precious
 Death and merits of my blessed Saviour and redeemer
 Jesus Christ and my body from whence it was taken
 to be buried in such decent and Christian manner as to
 my Executors hereafter named shall think meet and
 convenient And as touching such worldly Estate as the
 Lord in his mercy hath lent me my will and man-
 ner is that the same shall be employed as hereafter
 by this my will and Testament is expressed And first
 I do revoke frustrate and make void all former wills by
 me formerly made and declare this to be my last will
 and Testament only I do give my will and desire is
 that my Tract or Division of land whereon I now live
 be equally divided between my two sons William Young
 and Henry Young beginning at two small thickets
 in Rappahannock river side in a tract of wood land
 ground over a small stream between my dwelling house
 and greater standing of the head of the said tract so
 along

along a line of marked trees made & marked by me
 (before Dick Bush Dick Carter John Contance and
 John Young) to the above said Creek to the head of
 of the said Dividend of two hundred acres and be
 near the said Land being formerly granted to Henry
 Soules the one moiety or equall part whereon my
 House I now live on stand I give to my son William
 Young and to his heirs for ever the other part I give
 unto my son Henry Young and to his heirs for ever
 not depriving my wife of her right of Dower &c
 Item I give my dear and Loving wife Katherine Young
 the best bed and furniture in my house and five
 pounds sterling to her and to her heirs for ever. Item
 My will and desire is that all my negroes and my
 personall Estate be appraised by three honest men
 chosen by my Executors. — Will Young Esq^r
 Item My will and desire is that my son John Young
 shall have all that tract or dividend of Land which
 was bequeathed unto me by James Martin deceased
 I give to him and his heirs for ever. Item My will
 and desire is that after my negroes and personall
 Estate is appraised that it be equally divided between my
 wife & the having her dower first paid and six children
 named William Young Elizabeth Young Henry Young
 Mary Young Kate Young and John Young; my wife
 to enjoy her part of the division during her naturall
 life and then to be equally divided amongst my six
 children all which I give my six children and
 their heirs for ever. Item my will and desire is that
 the which my wife is now bigg with if it should be a
 male child that then my desire is and I bequeath and
 bequeath unto it all that tract or dividend of Land
 which I bought of William Smith being one hundred
 and fifty six acres of Land joining unto my Land to the
 said Child & to his heirs for ever But in case it should be a
 female then to be equally divided between my two sons
 William Young and Henry Young. Item my purpose

will is that my wife keep the Children and their
 Estates until they come to age to take their own Parts
 themselves. Lastly I constitute and appoint my loving
 wife Executrix and my son William Young and my
 son Henry Young Executors of this my Last will
 and Testament as witness my hand and seal this
