 poorest of parish in the parish thirty Shillings in such things as may answer their wants to be paid within one year after
 my decease by my Ex^{ors} secondly I will bequeath unto my son Thomas Younger that piece of Land that I bought of
 Mr. Will^m & Richard Jones a young husband called fair made other somers mrs. & if she should be married to be her own & no
 other then to have a Young Cou^{nt} out of my own proper store of Wool of if she should dye then to have another young
 Cou^{nt} in her room out of my own proper store of six pound Curr^{ent} that gun which I bought of Cap^t White thirdly I will
 bequeath unto my son John Younger that piece of Land that I bought of Mary & Volant two young Cou^{nts} out of my own
 proper store of six pound Curr^{ent} the fourth of my eldest two guns if either of my two sons Thomas or John dye without
 issue then their Land money & gun to fall to my son James Younger if both should dye then his part of Land money &
 gun to fall to the eldest female then alive & so my will is that the Land in whose hands any of the boys Land fall to the
 other part of their share shall be equally divided amongst the rest then alive they themselves that have the Land having
 one equal part thereof it is my will that the two eldest then alive of the female kind if the male be all dead should
 inherit the Land as my will is that after appraisement made that my estate be equally divided amongst my other six
 Children to wit James Younger Eliz^{abeth} Younger Ann Younger Mary Younger James Younger & Susanna Younger
 and further it is my will that if any of them dye without issue lawfully begotten of their body that their part to be
 equally divided amongst the rest then alive & if it is my will remaining every one of my Children part of the Estate if they
 die without issue lawfully begotten of their body to be still equally divided amongst the rest then alive & further it is my will that
 if my beloved wife Rebecca Younger should happen to join in Wedlocke after my decease it is my will that her wages should
 be for the space of the age of seven years & if she continued my widow then to remain till the year of her widow
 and if it should please God to remove all things are subject to remove all my issue by death then it is my will that my Land &
 personall Estate be granted for my next heir in Ireland of my brother Andrew only my wife to have the liberty of the
 same all her days in a moderate way to live upon without controul of any person whatsoever This I do when I do ordaine
 and appoint to my well beloved wife Rebecca Younger my son Thomas Younger to see the same truly executed & fully
 performed in witness whereof I have affixed my seal & set my hand this day of your first written
