of my sins past my soul may easily be divinely interred by my selfe hereafter named in the hope of a

happy resurrection at the last day & my sole body to enter into perfect joye & felicity for evermore before the settling & disposing of my  
Temporal estate & such goods & chattels as it shall please God first above my deserts to bestow upon me to ordaine and dispose  
as follows & that is to say first all that doth devide ab owe in right or otherwise to any person whatsoever shall be sold &  
truly accounted & paid within convenient time after my decease by my executors hereafter named first will & bequeath unto the three  
peopple objects of pity in the parish Hartley Skellingthwaite & such things as may answer their worth to be paid within one year after  
my decease by my executors hereafter named first & bequeath unto my son Thomas Younger that part of Land that I bought of  
Mr. Wm. Hulme Richard Jones a young taylor named for me & other somes whereof if it happeneth to be but one or no land  
Brodsworth then to have a young son out of my own proper share of Chatel & if he shalldye then to leave another young  
son in his room out of my own proper share & so pone curte & shall give residue to my son of Cpt. Wm. Hulme will &  
Bequeath unto my son John Younger that part of Land that I bought of Marye Vassall his young son out of my own  
proper share & so pone curte & shall leave of my other two gunt & a siller of my two sons Thomas & John dyd without  
issuethion their Land money of him to sell to my son James Younger & if both shalldye then his part of Land money &  
gunt to fall to this least sonale then also my will is that the gunt in whose hand any of his bothe land fall to his  
other part of their share shall be equally divided amonst this rest then also they husbandes that have this Land having  
one equal part thereof it is my will that the two thereof then also of his sonnes bind if the male be all dead should  
inherit the Land assyng will to that effect apperasement made that my estate be equally divided amongst my other 3 sies  
Queens to wife James Younger & J. Younger and Younger Mary Younger named Younger & Susanna Younger  
and further it is my will that if any of them die without issue lawfully begotten of their body that then their part to be  
equally divided amongst his rest thidie also & it is my will remouing everie one of my Children part of this Estate if they  
die without issue lawfully begotten of their body then shall equally divided amongst the rest then also & furthere it is my will that  
if my beloved wife Roberta Younger shalld happen to joyn in Wm. Hulme estate after my decease it is my will that the boyes should  
be for them selde at the age of seventeen years old & if she continueth my widow then to remain till the age of twenty one  
and if it shalld please God to letum all thinges are subject to remeys all my issue by deatle then it is my will that my Land &  
personall estate be farred for my next heir in chaland of my brother Andrew only my wife to have the liberty of the  
same all her dayes in a moderate waye lesse upon without Controfle of any person whatsover this to be witness  
and appoint is my wellbeloved wifes Roberta Younger & my son Thomas Younger his hand truly executed & fully  
Performed in witness whereof I have affixed my hand & setting hand this day of year first written

Huddie will & Bequeath unto my son John Younger that pson of Land that I bought of Marye Vassall his young heire out of my own proper stots & if she shold dye then to leave another young heire in her room out of my two sond Thomas or John dyng without issue from them Land money or hym to fall to my son James Younger & if he shold dye then his part of Land money or hym to fall to this next sonne then also my will is that hee in whose hand any of the bove Land falleth to the other part of their share shall be equally diuided amangst this rest then also they heires shold that haue his Land having one quare part thereof it is my will that the two next then also of his sonnes shold if hee make his will dead shold inherit the Land assyng my will is that after appraisement made that my estate be equally diuided amongst my other heires Elizabeth to witt James Younger & Mary Younger & Anna Younger & Isabella Younger and further it is my will that if any of them die without issue lawfully begotten of their body that then their part to be equally diuided amangst his rest kinnes & so it is my will remouing ouer one of my children part of the estate if they die without issue lawfully begotten of their body then still equally diuided amangst the rest then also & further to my will that if my beloved wife Roberta Younger shold happen to joyn in Wedlock stale after my decease it is my will that the boyes shold be for them selfe at the age of sevendean years old & if she continued my widow then to remain till the yere of hundre and sixt and if it shold please god to let them all living and subject to remeys all my issues by deasce then it is my will that my Land & personall estate be fauored for my next heire in d'aleland of my brother Andrew only my wife to have the liberty of the same all her day in a moderate waye leuise upon without controul of any person whatsover The testator doth ordaine and appoint to my wellbeloved wif Roberta Younger my son Thomas Younger to have & to haue truly & fully performed in witness whereof I have affixed my hand & setting my hand this day of your first month
