 singular his goods chattels & credits of the said person whereto hee comes to the hands
 possession or knowledge of him the said Joseph Anderson or into the hands or possession of any other
 person or persons for him & his same so made do remitt or cause to be exhibited unto the County
 Court of Essex at such time as his said & heretofore required by the said Court and the same goods
 chattels & credits & all other his goods chattels & credits of the said person at his time of his death
 or whereto at any time after shall come to his hands or possession of the said Joseph or into his hands
 or possession of any other person or persons whatsoever do well & truly and according to Law & practice
 do make a true & just account of his actions & doings heretofore which heretofore required by the said Court
 and also do well & truly pay & deliver all his Legacies contained & specified in his last will
 as far as the said goods chattels & credits will heretofore extend according to the value thereof & the
 Law shall charge him then this obligation to be void of all effect otherwise to remain in full
 force & virtue.
