Witness our hands & seals this 10th day of October 1722.

Che Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above named John Evans
Guardian of Benjamin Sawyer his birth Brothers & Administrators do & shall well & truly pay or cause to be paid
unto the Prothonotary all such debts & Dated as now is or hereafter shall come to the hands of the Prothonotary
as soon as the Prothonotary shall attain to lawfull age or when thereunto required by the Justices of the Peace
for the County Court as up to say so long including the Prothonotary then late & Surveyor from all bounds and
duties that shall or may arise about the said debts. Then this Obligation to be void & discharge to stand
& remain in full force & virtue.

In the name of god Amen. Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Edward Paget lying in County of Essex in present health memory I have to go for the same, first I remeind my self into the hands of the Almighty -
God who gave it me hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ to receive the same at the last day to
enjoy eternall life & command my body to be buried in decent & Christian manner according to ex-
ecution of my Executors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Paget one
hundred acres of Land being more or less situate lying & being in the County of Essex beginning at a
white Oak standing by or near a brant that doth proue out of my foring brant and running through
a plantation that doth belong to my Son Edward & so running to a red Oak standing near the tree that
passe my Land and Thomas Butterfield & so along the said line running to a brant called the Brant
butts brant and so down the same to the white Oak at first begun all whiche said Land I
give unto my Son John Paget and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever. Item I give &
bequeath unto my Son Abraham Paget one hundred acres of Land being more or less situate lying &
being in the County of Essex beginning at a white Oak standing upon a Totemo house standing on a rising
brant whiche passe my Son John Paget & my Son Abraham and so running along a line of market
trees whiche I have already made betwix them to yesterges line thence down the same line to the
brant that is shoun by the name of the Quarter brant thence down the same to the
Totemo house shewing thence up the said to the first mentioned plantation all whiche said I give
unto my Son Abraham & his heirs for ever lawfully begotten of his body. Item I give &
bequeath unto my Son Henry Paget the plantation whiche I now have or all the Land thereto
belonging unto him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever after my decease. Item I give
& bequeath unto my Son Stephen Paget my Son Francis Paget my Son Abraham Paget my Son

John Daget my Daugter Marye our chilidg to both of them to be paid after my decease and all the cost of my
estate & goods to be brought unto my Sonnes wife Elizabeth Daget during of her natural life & after to returne to
my son Henry Daget & my daughter Elizabeth Daget their heirs for ever and I do constitute & appoint my well
beloved wife Elizabeth Daget & my son Henry Daget my sole executors of this my last will and
testament concerning all other wills and testaments heretofore by me made. This Will is signed my hand & seal
