payment whereof we have our selves our heirs &c. & Administrators jointly and severally & lawfully by these
presents **Witness** our hands & seals this 16. day of October 1722.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bound John Deane
Administrator of Benjamin Deane his heirs &c. & Administrators do & shall well & lawfully pay or cause to be paid
unto the said Joseph Smith all such Debts & Demands so now is or hereafter shall come to the hands of the said John
Deane as soon as the said Debts shall attain to lawful age or when the same are required by the Justices of the Peace
for the County of Fox as aforesaid & shall not delay the said Justices their heirs &c. from all rewards and
damages that shall or may arise about the said Debts. Then this Obligation to be void otherwise to stand
& remain in full force & virtue.

memory thanks is to god for the same, first I commend my soul into the hands of the almighty
God who gave it me hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ to receive the same at the last day to
enjoy eternal life & I commend my body to be buried in decent & Christian manner according to the
direction of my Executors hereafter named. Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Paget one
hundred acres of Land being more or less situated lying & being in the County of Fox beginning at a
white Oak standing by or near a beam that doth proceed out of my Spring beault and running through
a plantation that doth belong to my Son Edward & so running to a red Oak standing near the line that
part my Land and Thomas Lutteridges & so along the said Line thence to a meadow called the Edwards
house Swamp and so down the said Swamp to the white Oak at first began all which said Land I
give unto my Son John Paget and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever. Item I give &
bequeath unto my Son Abraham Paget one hundred acres of Land being more or less situated lying &
being in the County of Fox beginning at a white Oak standing upon it. Thence through a Swamp on a running
beault which part my Son John Paget & my Son Abraham and so running along a line of marked
trees which I have already made betwixt them to Lutteridges line thence down the said line to the
Swamp that is ended by the name of the Quaker Swamp thence down the said line to the
Edwards house Swamp thence up the said line to the first mentioned Station all which said Land I give
unto my Son Abraham & his heirs for ever lawfully begotten of his body. Item I give &
bequeath unto my Son Henry Paget the plantation where I now live on & all the Land thereunto
belonging unto him & his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever after my death. Item I give
& bequeath unto my Son Ephraim Paget, my Son Francis Paget, my Son Abraham Paget, my Son

 beloved wife Elizabeth Dapst & my son Henry Dapst my nob & sole Executors of this my last will and
 Testament according all due rites and Testaments heretofore by me made In witness my hand & Seal
 this 18th day of July 1722.

 Henry or into the hands & possession of any other person whatsoever do well & truly & lawfully according
