& William Gresham & Martha Gresham & John Gresham slaves of Calais equally to be divided between the parties mentioned
I give and devise unto my well beloved wife & my first Son all my wifes personal estate equally to be divided among them all my
legges bed her bed & dishes & plates my desire is that my well beloved wife Mary may live after my Children till they shall
come of age to be the age of twenty one years & I do hereby ordain & appoint my beloved wife Mary Gresham my wife &
sole Executor of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I the above named Charles Gresham have set my hand & seal this 20th day of March 1725.
