I Charles Grosman of the parish of St. Andrew County of York being sick & weak in body but of perfect sound memory do make this my last will & Testament in manner & form following my soul I commend unto Almighty God my Saviour & my body to be buried in decent manner & my estate I dispose of as follows that is to say first I give and devise unto my wellbeloved son Thomas Grosman one negro woman named Jenny when he shall come to the age of twenty one years I give and devise unto my wellbeloved wife Mary Grosman my five sons Robert Grosman Thomas & William Grosman & Charles Grosman & John Grosman eleven heads of Cattle equally to be divided between the parties mentioned I give and devise unto my wellbeloved wife & my five sons all my whole personal estate equally to be divided among them all my liagg & debts herof & I desire & please my desire is that my wellbeloved wife Mary may live after my Order till they shall come of age to be the age of twenty one years & so hereby ordain & appoint my beloved wife Mary Grosman my whole & sole Executor of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof I the above named Charles Grosman have hereunto set my hand & seal this 12th day of March 1725.
