The Condition

of the above obligation is such that if the above bound James Blasingham guardian of Thomas Doherty his heirs & assigns do & shall well & truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Orphan all such Estate and Effects as now is or hereafter shall come to the hands of the said James as soon as the said Orphan shall attain to Lawfull age or when thereunto required by the Justices of the peace for the County Court as also to save & keep harmless the said Justices their heirs and assigns from all troubles & damages that shall or may arise about the said Estate then this obligation to be void otherwise to be in full force & virtue.
