The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Grace Hawkins adm^r with the will an next of all the goods chattels and debts of John Hawkins dead do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said dead which have or shall come to y^e hands possession or knowledge of the said Grace Hawkins or into the hands & possession of any other person or persons for her and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Essex at such time as she shall be thereto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits and all other the goods chattels and credits of the said dead at the time of his Death or which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said Grace or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for her do well and truly adm^r according to Law and further do make a true and just account of her doings and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court and also do well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies contained and specified in the said Testament as far as the said goods chattels and credits will thereunto extend according to the value thereof and the Law shall charge her. Then this obligation to be void & of none effect otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.

It my will is that if my said Daughter Elizabeth should die without issue lawfully begotten James Nowell and Elizabeth his wife my beloved Sister should have the the whole estates during the life of my said Sister Elizabeth and that after her decease my whole estate of what nature soever should be equally divided between his Children of James Nowell begot before him and my said Sister Elizabeth. It I ordain James Nowell and my beloved Sister Elizabeth his wife my heirs to see this my last will and Testament duly performed In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal in presence of Mr. Thomas Collett D^r Mungo Roy & Thomas Montoith this 16th day of April Anno Domⁱ 1726.
