Now all Men by these p^{ts} sent that we James Harguson, James Boughan, and William Dunn j^{rs} are held & firmly bound unto Thomas Waring, Robert Brooke, Alexander Parker and Richard Tyler jun^r Justices of the County of Essex their Ex^{ts}, Adm^{rs}, and Assigns in the sum of One hundred and forty two pounds eighteen shillings & two pence to the which payment well and truly to be made we bind our selves our heirs Ex^{ts}, and Adm^{rs} jointly and severally firmly by these p^{ts} sent Witness our hands & seal the 20th day of October An^o Dⁿⁱ 1730

The Condition of the above Obligation is such that whereat by virtue of an Order of Essex County Court dated the 18th day of August 1730 the Estate of the Orphan of Edward Faulkner dec^d was delivered by James Coghill to the s^d James Harguson for want of Countersecurity Now if the above bound James Harguson shall well and truly pay or deliver all the s^d Orphan's Estate now in his hands (as may appear by a report recorded the day of the date hereof) to all such persons as the s^d Justices or their Successors shall Order & direct & shall from time to time save and keep harmless and indemnified the s^d Justices their heirs Ex^{ts} & Adm^{rs} from all damages that may hereafter happen to them by reason of the s^d Estate & also from time to time give the s^d Justices & their Successors such security as they shall require Then the above Obligation to be void & of no effect else to be & remain in full
