

In the name of God Amen I Edward Woflesby of this County in S^t Amis parish being in good health perfect sound & sound memory thankes be to god for it do make and ordaine this my last will & Testament in manner following first I give and bequeath my Soul to god that gave it me & my body to the Earth to be Christian like buried at the discretion of my Ex: hereafter named & of my worldly goods I dispose as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto Elias & Newman & his heirs lawfully begotten all that plantation whereto he now dwelleth with the land adjoining to the said plantation in trust with a kind of marked trees to him the said Elias Newman & his heirs as aforesaid forever after want of such heir or heirs the said land above bequeathed to be equally divided between William Woflesby son of Henry Woflesby & Benjamin Woflesby son of Robert Woflesby after the decease of my loving wife Eliz: Woflesby Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife my negroes to wit my negro Dicks her servant & my negro Sarah & her increase to her my said wife & her heirs for ever Item I give and bequeath unto my said wife all my personal estate of what kind soever Item I give and bequeath unto my friend James Morrison all my marsh adjoining to his land to him & his heirs for ever Item I give unto my loving wife all my land not before bequeathed for enduring her natural life & after the decease of her my said wife then I give and bequeath unto Henry Woflesby son of Robert Woflesby a part of my land adjoining to the land above bequeathed to Elias Newman bounded by the great branch next to my now dwelling plantation & from the head of the said branch by a line of marked trees to my back line to him & his heirs lawfully begotten for ever & for want of such heir to the next heir at law Item I will that after the decease of my loving wife all my land (not before bequeathed) except my part of the white oak swamp her aforesaid disposed of as for William Woflesby & do give and bequeath after as aforesaid the said remainder except as aforesaid to him the said William Woflesby son of Henry Woflesby to him & his heirs lawfully begotten for ever & for want of such heir to the next heir at law from my will is that if Elias Newman Henry Woflesby or William Woflesby die without heirs lawfully begotten no heir at law appear that then he or their partner or partners of land by me bequeathed be for greate land for the use of S: Amis parish for ever Item I will that all my land in the white oak swamp be for common use (after the decease of my wife) between Elias Newman Benjamin Woflesby & William Woflesby & their heirs as aforesaid & that neither of them nor their heirs shall cut timber out of the said white oak swamp without each others consent & that they the said Legatees Elias Newman Benjamin Woflesby & William Woflesby & their heirs pay an equal part of the quittrent for the said lands oak swamp from year to year & do appoint my loving wife Eliz: Woflesby wife and sole executrix of this my last will & Testament Witness my hand & seal this thirtieth day of January anno Domini 1726.

The above last will & Testament of Edward Woflesby deceased was proved by the oath of Elizabeth Woflesby his daughter therin named & being further proved by the oaths of the witnesses hereunder is admitted to record.

In the name of God Amen I John Cook of S: Amis parish in this County being sick and weak in body but of sound mind & memory praised be god do make & ordaine & constitute this my last will & Testament in manner following first & principally I command my Soul to Almighty God that gave it my body to the Earth to be decently interred according to the disposition of my Ex: hereafter named Item I

give & bequeath the plantation whereof I now dwell & all the appurtenances thereto abiding containing one hundred & two acres or thereabouts to my Son Joshua Cook & his heirs & their heirs not interrupting or hindring him or his to have & enjoy part of the house or land during his widowhood where the same is most proper for her use making no waste lands or distinction thereto. Item I give away and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cook & his heirs forty seven acres of land which I formerly took up adjacent to the former office my wearing apparel & riding horse from my negro named Roger Waters sale to Dolly Cook unto my well beloved wife Susanna Cook during her natural life provided she lives in widowhood during the same I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law William McColley & Hannah his wife my negro woman named Dinah with her wages to the heirs of the said William & Hannah item after my wife decesses leaving in widowhood as aforesaid I give & bequeath my aforesaid Negro named Roger to my Son Joshua Cook & my other negro named Balthasar to my son William Cook that named Jane Clancy Son Thomas Cook & his other named Dolly to my Granddaughter Mary Diswick & to their several heirs respectively. But if my aforesaid wife Susanna should happen to intermarry it is my will intent & meaning that at the time thereof she have nor claim any further right or property in any of my negroes left to her as aforesaid during her natural life but that they & every of them to whom they are hereby bequeathed know and to be their negro & negroes immediately theron paid as well as they might or could render take & enjoy the same after her decease only my Son in Law William McColley & Hannah his wife shall enjoy the said Negro named Dinah which now they have in possession from this time forward without any interruption whatsoeuer from me given to my daughter Hannah wife to William McColley aforesaid my great gift chest of drawers & candle stands from me given to my Granddaughter Mary Diswick one feather bed and furniture from all the rest & residue of my Estate of what nature or quality soever given to my aforesaid wife to be equal to be equally divided partly I make ordain constitute & appoint my beloved wife Susanna my Son Joshua Cook & my Son in Law William McColley & of this my last will & Testament & furnishing & making void all other wills by me hitherto made do publish declare & publish to be my last will & Testament this 3^d day of March 1726/7.

Know all men by these presents that we Susanna Cook Joshua Cook & William McColley doth solemnly & sincerely declare & warrant that we hold & firmly bind unto William Damer field Saxon & Weston Road Brooks & Nicholas Smith Justices of the County of Essex in the sum of five hundred pounds Sterling to be & paid payment well & truly to be made we bind our hands & by & seal'd jointly & severally to the said Justices their heirs & successors firmly by these presents witness our hands & seals this 20th day of June anno Domini 1727.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Susanna Cook Joshua Cook & William McColley & of the last will & Testament of Joshua Cook doth or shall do make a true and perfect present or any other singular thing good chattels & goods of the said Damer which silver or plate come to the hands of either or both of the said Susanna Joshua & William or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons than at the time of making or exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Essex of Justice & they shall be & are required by the said Court of the same Goods chattels & goods & all other & possessions & chattels & goods of the said deceased at the time of his death or which at any time after shall come to the
