 out of which my lawfull and just debts being first paid then it is my will and desire that
 my Dear wife Mary Oswald ^{should} possess and enjoy my whole estate here in Virginia, personall
 and real during her natural life Ith I give and bequeath unto my lawfull brothers &
 Sisters in Scotland Viz: David James & Robert Isabell & Elizabeth Oswald & my dutifull
 Children in Law herein, Virginia, viz: Ludowick John, and Mary and Elizabeth Rowers
 all and haile my real and personall Estate herein Virginia, &c. &c. and money that may
 be now due or become due to me in glasgow and all other houses and Lands in Scotland
 except the house where I dwell Henry Oswald died to be divided among my Brothers Sisters
 & their heirs lawfully begotten for ever but not to enjoy any part of it untill my wifes decease
 Item I give unto my good friends Col: John Lomax ten pounds & unto James Jamison eight
 to buy them a suit of black Cloaths if they please so to use it lastly I constitute and appoint
 my loving wife Mary Oswald & my son in law Ludowick Ronger Col: John Lomax &
 James Jamison &c. of this my last will and Testament In testimony whereof I
 have hereunto affixed my hand and Seal this twelfth day of febr Anno Dom: 1725/6

 will and Testament of Henry Oswald dead do make or cause to be made a true and perfect
 Inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and Credits of the said dead which have or shall
 come to y^e hands possession, or knowledge of y^e said Mary or into the hands or possession of
 any other person or persons for her and the said so made do Exhibit or cause to be
 Exhibited into the County Court of Essex at such time as shd shall be thereunto required
 by the said Court & the same goods chattels & Credits & all other the goods Chattels and Credits
