In the NAME OF GOD I Henry Keeves  
of South Farnham parish in the County of Essex in Virginia Planter being  
sick of body but of perfect sense and memory thanks be to the Almighty God  
and faithfully to mind the transitory Estate on man and that all flesh must  
yield to death when please God to call do make and Ordain this my last  
Will and Testament in manner & forme following First & principally —  
I bequeath my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God not doubting  
but trusting through the merits and passion of Jesus Christ my  
Saviour and redeemer to receive forgiveness of all my many sins &  
wickedness and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion  
of my executors hereafter named, and for what worldly Estate it hath  
pleased God to bestow upon me I give & bequeath in manner and form  
following — Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Keeves  
two hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live during her natural life  
and after her decease my land and Plantation given to her I give  
to my Son Henry Keeves and to his heirs lawfully begotten for ever Item  
I lend my W<sup>m</sup> to Sarah Keeves four Negroes vizt Negro Will, Jenny, Caesar  
and Philey during her natural life and after her decease to be equally  
divided between my children hereafter mentioned John, Samuel, Thomas,  
George, Patience, Elizabeth, & Ann to them and their heirs lawfully  
begotten, and in case either of my children should dye without heir lawfully  
begotten then to be divided amongst the surviving children above named  
Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Keeves all the remaining  
part of the tract of land I now live on to him & his heirs lawfully begotten  
for ever and for want of such heirs his my will and desire that the land  
shall go to the next male heir at Law and so to continue it from heir to heir  
of that Name so as never to goe out of the name of the Keeves, And also  
I give my son Henry Keeves three negroes, vizt Negro Kerto, Doll, and London  
and their increase for ever with what cattle horses hogg household Stuff  
and other necessaries I have heretofore given him — Item I give & bequeath  
to my son Joseph Keeves this land & plantation he now lives on being  
two hundred Acres of land I bought of Richard Taylor to him & his  
heirs for ever with what money I lent him and cattle horses, hogg, and  
household Stuff which I have heretofore given him — Item I give &  
bequeath to my son John Keeves the plantation and land he now lives  
on, on the west side of the main road that goes by the church in the  
parish of South Farnham being part of the land which I bought of  
Edmon Taylor to him & his heirs for ever But in case he should dye  
without issue then it is my will and desire that it should go to my son  
Samuel Keeves and his heirs for ever — Item I give and bequeath

to my son Samuel Reeves the remaining part of the land that I & he  
bought of Dmon Taylor lying on the East side of the main road that  
goes by the church in the parish of Southfarnham where he now lives —  
to him and his heirs for ever But in case he should dye without issue —  
then to my will and desire that it should go to my son John Reeves and  
his heirs for ever — Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Keeves  
two hundred acres of land that I bought of Augustin Smith lying at the  
falls of Rappahannock River to him & his heirs for ever but in case he  
should dye without heir then to my will and desire that it should go —  
to my son George Reeves and his heirs for ever — Item I give and  
bequeath to my son George Reeves one hundred acres of land which —  
I bought of Peter Byrom and joining to the land I gave my son Thomas  
Reeves likewise I give all the land which I bought of Edin Thacker let it  
be more or less being in Southfarnham parish to him & his heirs for ever —  
but in case he should dye without issue then to my will and desire that it  
should go to my son Thomas Reeves & his heirs for ever — Item I give  
unto my daughter Patience two negroes vizt Frank & Philip and their  
increase to her & her heirs lawfully begotten — Item I give unto my  
daughter Elizabeth Reeves two negroes vizt Rose & Jugg with their increase  
to her & her heirs lawfull begotten — Item I give unto my daughter Ann  
Reeves two negroes vizt Judy and Violet with their increase from this  
day to her and her heirs lawfully begotten — Item Tie my will and  
desire that if either of my daughters should dye without issue that their  
two negroes above given shall go to the surviving heir — Item I give  
unto my daughter Elizabeth & Ann Reeves five pounds each per annum  
Tis my will and desire that my daughters Elizabeth & Ann Reeves do  
live with my wife till they are married — Item I give unto my son George  
Reeves twenty pound Sterling — Item Tie my will and desire after my  
aforesd legacies and debts are paid that the remainder part of my  
parsonal Estate be equally divided in three parts (Except my Negroes  
that are not yet given away) and my beloved wife Sarah Reeves to  
have one part, and the other two parts with the Negroes that is not  
divided away to be equally divided between my seven youngest children  
vizt John, Samuel, Thomas, George, Patience, Elizabeth, and Ann  
to them and their lawfull heirs for ever — Item Tie my will that what  
money I lent my son in Law Richard Gatewood be brought into the  
asprainment which I think is fourteen pounds — Item Tie my will and  
desire that my will be proved within three months after my death if  
Court permitte and that each child to take his or her part of the —  
estate as soon as conveniently can be done — Item I do appoint and  
ordain constitute my beloved wife Sarah Reeves and my son George  
Reeves and My Son Joseph Reeves Executors to this my last will  
and Testament revoking & denying all other will or wills by  
me heretofore made — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and fixed my seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1728 —

gentleman of Essex County being sick of body but of sound mind and —  
Memory do command my soul into the hands of Almighty God and —  
committ my body to his dust and of such worldly goods as it hath pleased  
God to entrust me with I dispose in the manner and form following —  
I give and bequeath to my cousin Thomas Waring Junr five negroes —  
Oliver George Harry General and Will with thirty head of cattle and Twenty  
One sheep to him and his heirs for ever — Item It is my will that three  
Negroes Kate, Dinah, & Nann their increase with twenty head of cattle  
and all their issues and profits remain in the possession of any Executrix  
until my Nieces Betty & Susanna Gouldman arrive to the age of Twenty  
One years or Mary all which Negroes cattle issues and profits I give  
to be equally divided between my two Nieces to them and their heirs for  
ever — Item I give to each of my two Nieces Susanna and Betty one feather  
bed & furniture when they come of age or marry Item It is my will that —  
either of my Nieces die before she comes of age or marry that all I have —  
given them shall go to the survivor for ever — Item I give to my Cousin —  
Elizabell wife to Capt Thomas Waring thousand of three negroes Frank —  
Tom and of their increase during the term of her life and after —  
her death I give them to be equally divided between my Cousins Betty and —  
Molly Waring to them for ever — Item I give all my other Negroes not men-  
tioned in my will to be equally divided between Francis and Betty Waring  
my Cousins to them and their heirs for ever — Item I give to my Cousin Elizabell  
Waring and to each of her four children One Mourning ring of Twenty Shillings  
Value — Item I give to William Edwin & Elizabeth Waringfield to each of them  
One Mourning ring — Item I give all my interest right & title to any negroes —  
in Capt Waring's possession that are liable to the same disputes as those —  
whom my Brother now lies him for to my Cousin Elizabell Waring — Item  
I give and bequeath to the sd Elizabell Waring all my other Estates which I have  
not given away in this will both real & personal to her & her heirs forever —  
Lastly I appoint Capt Thomas Waring Thomas Waring Junr and my —  
Cousin Elizabell Waring Executrix of this my last will and hereby revoke  
all other wills by me made conflicting and appointing this my last will  
& Testament to be Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand &  
affixed my Seal this seventh day of October in the year of our Lord —  
One thousand Seven hundred & Twenty & Two —
