In the name of God Amen. I Henry Keeve
of Southfarnham parish in the County of Essex in Virginia Planter being
sick of body but of perfect sense and memory thanks be to the Almighty God
and willing to mind the transitory Estate on man and that all flesh must
yield to death when please God to call, do make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in manner & forme following. First & principally -
I bequeath my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God not doubting
but trusting through the merits and passion of Jesus Christ my
Saviour and redeemer to receive forgiveness of all my many sad sins &
wickedness and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion
of my Executors hereafter named, and for what worldly Estate it hath
please God to bestow upon me. I give & bequeath in manner and form
following - Item I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Keeve
two hundred Acres of Land whereon I now live during her naturall
life and after her decease my land and Plantation given to her, I give
to my Son Henry Keeve and to his heirs lawfully begotten for ever. Item
I lend my wife Sarah Keeve four Negroes viz^t Negro Will, Jenny, Saffor,
and Phily during her naturall life and after her decease to be equally
divided between my Children hereafter mentioned John, Samuel, Thomas,
George, Patience, Elizabeth, & Ann to them and their heirs lawfully
begotten, and in case either of my Children should dye without heir lawfully
begotten then to be divided amongst the surviving Children above named
Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Keeve all the remaining
part of the tract of land I now live on to him, & his heirs lawfully begotten
for ever and for want of such heirs tis my Will and desire that the land
shall go to the next male heir at Law and so to continue it from heir to heir
of that Name for ever, to goe out of the name of the Keeves, And also -
I give my Son Henry Keeve three negroes viz^t Negro Kerto, doll, and London
and their increase for ever with what cattle horses hogg^s household stuff
and other necessaries I have heretofore given him - Item I give & bequeath
to my Son Joseph Keeve the land & plantation he now lives on being
two hundred Acres of land I bought of Richard Taylor to him & his
heirs for ever with what money I lent him and cattle horses, hogg^s, and
household stuff which I have heretofore given him - Item I give &
bequeath to my Son John Keeve the plantation and land he now lives
on, on the west side of the main road that goes by the Church in the
parish of Southfarnham being part of the land which I bought of
Edmon Taylor to him & his heirs for ever But in case he should dye
without issue then it is my Will and desire that it should go to my Son
Samuel Keeve and his heirs for ever - Item I give and bequeath

to my son Samuel Keever the remaining part of the ^{sd} land that I
bought of Emon Taylor lying on the East side of the main road that
goes by the Church in the parish of Southfarnham & where he now lives -
to him and his heirs forever But in case he should dye without issue -
then tis my will and desire that it should go to my son John Keever and
his heirs forever - Item I give & bequeath to my son Thomas Keever
two hundred Acres of land that I bought of Augustin Smith lying at the
falls of Kappahanock River to him & his heirs for ever but in case he
should dye without heir then tis my will and desire that it should go -
to my son George Keever and his heirs for ever - Item I give and
bequeath to my son George Keever one hundred Acres of land which -
I bought of Peter Byrom and joining to the land I gave my son Thomas
Keever likewise I give all the land which I bought of Edwin Thacker let it
be more or less lying in Southfarnham parish to him & his heirs for ever
but in case he should dye without issue then tis my will and desire that it
should go to my son Thomas Keever & his heirs for ever - Item I give
unto my daughter Patience two negroes viz^t Frank & Philip and their
increase to her, & her heirs lawfully begotten - Item I give unto my
daughter Elizabeth Keever two negroes viz^t Kose, & Jugg with their increase
to her & her heirs lawfull begotten - Item I give unto my daughter Ann
Keever two negroes viz^t Judy and Violet with their increase from thence -
to her and her heirs lawfully begotten - Item tis my will and
desire that if either of my daughters should dye without issue that their
the negroes above given shall goe to the surviving heirs Item I give
unto my daughters Elizabeth & Ann Keever five pounds each currency.
Tis my will, and desire that my daughters Elizabeth, & Ann Keever do
live with my wife till they are married, Item I give unto my son George
Keever twenty pound Sterling Item tis my will and desire after my
afores^d legacies and debts are paid that the remainder part of my
personal Estate be equally divided in three parts (Except my Negroes
that are not yet given away) and my beloved wife Sarah Keever to
have one part, and the other two parts with the Negroes that is not
willed away to be equally divided between my seven youngest children
viz^t John, Samuel, Thomas, George, Patience, Elizabeth, and Ann
to them and their lawfull heirs forever Item tis my will that what
money I lent my son in Law Richard Galewood be brought into the
appraisment which I think is fourteen pounds. Item tis my will and
desire that my will be proved within three Months after my death if
Courts permitt and that each Child take his or her part of the
Estate as soon as conveniently can be don. Item I do appoint and
ordain constitute my beloved wife Sarah Keever and my son Henry
Keever and my son Joseph Keever Executors to this my last will
and Testament, revoking & denying all other will or wills by
me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and fixed my Seal this 28th day of April 1728

and all their Issues and profits remain in the possession of my Executors
until my Nieces Betty & Susanna Gentleman arrive to the age of Twenty
One Year or marry all which Negroes Cattle Issues and profits I give
to be equally divided between my two Nieces to them and their heirs for
Ever. Item I give to each of my two Nieces Susanna, and Betty one feather
bed & furniture when they come of age or marry Item It is my Will that
if either of my Nieces die before she come of age or marry that all I have
given them shall go to the Survivor for ever. Item I give to my Daughter
Frances one Negroe named Hester, Item I give to Mary Davids Servitor
to last having one thousand pounds of Tobacco Item I give to my Cousin
Molly having one Negroe whose with her increase and Negroe Mankely Sue
Youngest Child to her and her heirs for ever Item I give to my Cousin
Elizabeth wife to last Thomas having the use of three negroes Frank
Daw, & Tom and of their Increase during the term of her life and after
her death I give them to be equally divided between my Cousins Betty and
Molly having to them for ever Item I give all my other Negroes not men-
tioned in my Will to be equally divided between Francis and Betty having
my Cousins to them and their heirs for ever Item I give to my Cousin Elizabeth
having and to each of her four Children one Mourning ring of Twenty Shilling
Value Item I give to William Edwin, & Elizabeth Daingerfield to each of them
one Mourning ring Item I give all my interest right & title to any negroes
in last having's possession that are lyable to the same dispute as those
whom my Brother now owes him for to my Cousin Elizabeth having Item
I give and bequeath to the said Elizabeth having all my other Estate which I have
not given away in this Will both real & personal to her & her heirs for ever
Lastly I appoint last Thomas having Thomas having Junior and my
Cousin Elizabeth having Executors of this my last Will and hereby revoke
all other Wills by me made Constituting and appointing this my last Will
