I do hereby appoint this to be my Last Will & Testament as followeth First
Commit my body to the ground from whence it was taking there to be decently buried
my spirit to the hands of the Almighty God that gave it me through Jesus Christ my
Lord & Saviour. I give unto my beloved son James Reynolds half this Bident of

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Land it being five hundred acres where he now dwelleth and two Negroes vizt. Billy & Frank
which he hath in possession and five guineas to be paid in a Month. 3^{ly} I give unto my beloved wife
the thirds of my estate real and personal according to Law and the Rest of Divers. 4^{ly} I give
unto my beloved Son Benjⁿ Reynolds and my Grandson William Reynolds his other half of
the Diversit to be equally divided between them, only my Son Benjamin to have the first choice,
likewise I give unto my Son Benjⁿ Reynolds, that Land up at my Negro Master where Lucy
& Coll. Draketh together with four Negroes & three of them Workers to him & his heirs for
ever. 5^{ly} I give unto my beloved Daughter Violetta Reynolds two Negroes at the day of
Marriage and one of them a Worker to her & her heirs for ever. 6^{ly} I give
unto my Daughterannah Reynolds two Negroes at the day of Marriage & one of them
a Worker to her & her heirs for ever. 7^{ly} I give to my Daughter Susanna Reynolds
two Negroes at the day of Marriage and one of them a Worker to her & her heirs for
ever. 8^{ly} I give unto my Son Joseph Reynolds all my Lands in Glosster & two Negroes
one of them a Worker and the age of One & twenty to live & his heirs for ever. 9^{ly}
And if any of you should die without issue lawfully begotten or born of their own bodies
then to fall to the next male issue. 10^{ly} I constitute and appoint my two Sons James Re-
ynolds & Benjⁿ Reynolds sole Executors to this my Last Will & Testament. 11^{ly} I give
unto my Daughter Elizabeth Daniels our Gold ring also having her part before. 12^{ly}
and all my other moveables to be equally divided amongst these girls and two boys. 13^{ly}
I give to my God Son Andrew Reynolds one Negro at the age of One & twenty. As
Witness my hand and seal this 6 day of February 1727/8.
