 Doughton a piece of land Shalloon which is in the Chest I give my grand daughter Amy Heirs from it is my
 will and desire that my grand daughter Amy Heirs have all the rest of my Goods from I give and bequeath all
 the rest of my Estate be it of what nature or kind soever to my Son in law Jonathan Heirs & so appoint the
 said Jonathan Heirs &c. to this my last will and Testament revoking all other will or wills heretofore
