In the name of God Amen I John Bagge of S^t. Anns parish in the
County of Essex in the Colony of Virginia (being of sound mind and memory do make and
ordaine this to be my last will and Testament revoking and disanulling all or any former will
or wills & Testaments by me before made giving and bequeathing my Soul to God in hope of eternal
Salvation thro the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ my Saviour, and my body to its mother
Earth to be buried privately and at the parish Church of S^t. Anns if conveniently may be or
at any other parish, and as to my worldly estate which it has pleased God to bless me withal
I dispose of it in manner following Viz[?] 1. It is my will that all my just debts be paid & that
especially due to Col^o. Robert Carter upon a mortgage out of my personall estate if it can well
be 2. It is my desire that my estate be appraised & my will proved as soon as it can be after my
Decease 3. I give unto my beloved wife Mary and her heirs for ever, those following negroes or
Slaves Viz[?] Cornwall Black Jack Cesar (late the housewench) Peg Moll mulatto Sonny Ranny
Ned Betty with their ^{future} Increase also I give her during her natural life Moll the negro I
bought of Col^o. Covington with her Children named Frank and Hannah, and their future

Increase There being in full for and in lieu of my said wives Dower of my negroes or Slaves. 4. I give my wife her lawfull parton account of Dower of my personal estate after my debts are paid as aforesaid in the (as I take it) one third part 5. Moreover, I give my said wife my Chaise & horse called Terrick 6. My will that my said wife enjoy during her life the plantation I now live upon, but that in Case she (either by Land or other plantation) sufficient for my other negroes working with, sufficient houses for them to the satisfaction of my e^x hereafter named otherwise I do only give her the thirds of my Lands with the use of the dwelling house & garden of my dwelling plantation. 7. I give unto my Cousin Edmund Bagge one hundred pounds Sterling to be raised out of my personall estate after debts are paid & my wife's part allotted her or the profits of my estate 8. I give my mother & two sisters Ann Vaughan & Mary Kelly a pecuniary ring of twenty Shillings value to each. 9. I give unto my beloved Nephews William & John the Sons of my late brother Leonard Bagge and their heirs for ever, all the remaining part of my Negroes and Slaves together with those before mentioned as given to my wife during her life after my said wives decease together with the remaining part of my personall estate of which I have sever also my plantation I now live upon with that I bought of Thomas Jewell and all my Reversions of y^e Land I bought of Frank Gouldman to them my said Nephews William & John Bagge and their heirs for ever, but it is my will that if either ^{please to} take the lands the other be allowed a sum of half the value of the said Lands according to the valuation made by my Nephews Edmund and William Bagge sons of my Brother Luke Bagge so I make my said Nephews William & John the Sons of my Brother Leonard my e^x of this my last will and Testament I appoint my Nephews Edmund and William Bagge Sons of my brother Luke Bagge my e^x in trust for the said William & John Bagge & also my said e^x in trust to pay out of the produce and profits of my estate whilst the same shall be under their or either of their Care In witness here of this twentieth day of November in the year one thousand Seven hundred & twenty four I Sign & Seal the my last will and Testament & lodge the same in my Chest among my papers

At a Court held for y^e County of Inverday the 21st day of June Anno Domini 1726. Edmund Bagge one of the e^x in trust of the last will & Testament of John Bagge decessed made oath that he found the above said will in the Chest among the decessors papers & therein was written and all the Justices then sitting viz. John Lema & William Dainger swore that Callist Thomas Waring Saluator Muscod & Robert Brooke gent being fully satisfied that the said will was all of it written by the said Testator the said Edmund Bagge also making oath thereto attested and signed it was ordered to be recorded.

Now all men by these presents that we Edmund Bagge Robert Brooke Thomas Waring and Richard Booker are held and firmly bound unto John Lema & William Dainger for the sum of two thousand pounds Sterl. to the which payment well and truly to be made we bind our selves our heirs e^x & adm^r to the said Justices their heirs and Successors firmly by these presents Witness our hands & Seals this 21st day of June 1726.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Edmund Bagge e^x of the last will & Testament of John Bagge decessed do make or cause to be made a true & perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods chattels & Credits of the said Decessed which

have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Edmund or into his hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and his same made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Essex at such time as he shall be thereto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels and credits and all other the goods chattels and credits of the said decd at the time of his Death or which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said Edmund or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly adm^e according to Law and further do make a true and just account of his actings & doings therein when thereto required by the said Court and also do well & truly pay and Deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said Testament as far as the said goods chattels and credits will thereunto extend according to the value thereof and the Law shall Charge him then this obligation to be void and of no effect otherwise to remain in full force and virtue

Bryant being weak of body but of perfect sense and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner following first I bequeath my Soul to God that gave it trusting in his merit and mediation of our blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ my body I bequeath to the Earth to be buried as my Ex^{rs} shall see fitt my will is that the bargains I have made with Thomas Dagg for be fulfilled from my will is that my negro woman named Nann be free at my death & have liberty to live with some of my Children and also that she shall have thirty shillings paid her year so long as she lives by my heirs or Executors from I give unto my God daughter Ann M^{rs} one pair of gold boots from I give unto my two daughters Dorothy & Mary Vaughan each of them a gold ring from I give unto my Cousin Thomas Dagg thirty pounds sterling money to be paid to him when he comes to the age of twenty one my desire is that my real and personal estate be equally divided among all my Children further my desire is that Cap^t Robert Brooks have the bringing up of my Son John Vaughan there to be maintained by my Ex^{rs} out of my estate according as they shall think proper I do appoint Cap^t Thomas Waring my daughter Dorothy Ex^{rs} of this my last will & Testament & do herewith set my hand & seal this thirtieth day of January in the year
