 Virginia being in perfect memory and understanding made & doth acknowledge  
 God, do make & ordain my Last Will & Testament in manner  
 & form following. I bequeath my soul to God & my body to the Earth.  
 I give to my Loving wife Alice Lattell during her natural life eight  
 negroes to wit Robin, Tom, Sambo, Quay, Bob, Henry, Andate, Tom the  
 younger and my will is that the aforesaid Negroes be equally divided  
 between my two brothers John & Thomas Lattell at the death of my afore-  
 said wife. I likewise give to my Loving wife Alice & her heirs for ever,  
 three Negroes, viz. Hercules, Epes & Venus. I give to my Loving wife  
 all my Household goods that I am possessed with at this time. I likewise  
 give to my Loving wife all my Store of Horses Cattle Hogs & Sheep  
 and I do appoint my Loving wife Alice Lattell my Executor in Law  
 Mr. Francis Thornton my Executors. In Witness that this is my will

 This will was presented in Court by Francis Thornton one of the Executors within named  
 who made oath thereto, & being further proved by the oaths of the witnesses  
 thereto is admitted to record.

In the name of god amen I John Lattell of Epes County being  
 very sick & weak of body but in perfect sense & memory thanks be to God, do  
 make and ordain this my Last will & Testament in manner and form following  
 Imprimis I commend my soul to God hoping through his mercies death & passion  
 of my Saviour and redemer Jesus Christ to have his free pardon & forgiveness of  
 all my sins & my body to be decently buried by my Executor after  
 named and for the trumpet shall it health declare God to appear upon me I give  
 and bequeath as follows this I will that my debts be justly paid by my Executor

I leave to my two children John & Thomas my Daughter Margaret 1800 acres of  
 land in the County of Epes & 1000 acres in the County of Epes Virg. I give to my son  
 John & his wife the first 1000 acres on the river from the other part of the aforesaid

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tract of Land as followeth beginning at the corner tree of the hundred acres of Land I had  
in exchange of Charles Smith a little below the road in the line of hills going South East  
West up to the top of the first ledge of hills thence along the said ridge to the rolling road &  
along the said road to the base North two hours up & along the said Northwest line to the said  
of Evans so with the Line of Evans to the road then down the road to the beginning line I have  
I give to my Son Thomas and his heirs that part of the aforesaid tract of Land that lyeth on the  
South side of Cedar Creek main branch up & along its said branch to the second branch that  
messes out above the hills & with the said branch & the Southernmost said hill where  
the said hill endeth up to the rolling road then up the said <sup>road to the</sup> Northwest line of the aforesaid tract  
of Land lying South East to the mountain branch Northwest to the line of falls juxta  
& so therewith to the main branch of Cedar Creek I give to my Daughter Margaret  
During her natural life my dwelling plantation and the Land adjacent being part of my  
aforesaid tract of Land as also his Land I had of Charles Smith before ascending line all  
bounded by the Land before given to my Sons John & Thomas. Item I give to my Son Thomas  
Thomas all my part of the Land purchased by me and Richard Stetton of Newgate and  
Richard Petty being part of a Mortgage from Charles Smith to Martha Ferry Thomas and  
Richard Petty set by the Deed will appear Item I give to my Son Thomas his wife  
part of his said purchased Land to him & his wife Item I give to my other Thomas the  
area of Land lying in Pennsylvania evenly on the South West Mountain run and the  
hundred acres of Land being part of the same tract I give to my Grandson Elizetth Lee age  
lying under a Marry in the office of the Surveyor in my name to him their son & wife  
Item I give to my Daughter Margaret & her heirs Negro jeans, Shose, Charles Cloath, Cloath  
and all her Children, & his wife heirs of my father Gods bedfords blankets & a  
four pair of Sheets one Dappr. Talk Cloth & a Doz<sup>n</sup> of napkins a great number & what  
other things is called lins, a Looking glass, fifteen head of old & young cattle half my hogg  
and half my hogg one old feather bed & Covering that is rugg & blankets & my three  
Cloth & the old wroth Dull; Item I give to my Grand Daughter Martha Jolliford if she  
lives to the age of eighteen or married to her and to her heirs a Negro woman named Sue  
and all her Children & fifteen barrels of my Corn for their use & all the Negro working tools  
and I also appoint my Son John Callett Trafford for my Grand Daughter Martha & his progeny  
of the Negroes so long as they live with him under his care for their maintenance till my aforesaid  
Grand Daughter shall arrive to the age of eighteen or day of Marriage. Item I give to my  
Daughter Margaret half my powder, fire arms & Earthen Ware & these including & large  
iron pots, & stocks & two fayre guns and a pair of good fowls sent for I give to his wife  
half to her & particularly the goods sent for her up to the last of his former years & the other

half to my two sons John & Thomas, How I give to my Daughter in Law  
 Mrs Cattell all my Land in the force of Pownamand during her life or day  
 of her Marriage; & also four Negroes to wit Sambo & Jony & her two youngest  
 Children provided she makes no claims or litter to these negroes given by her  
 Husband so her whereth to paid for these land, but in case my said daughter in  
 Law Mrs Cattell shall pretend to make any claims to these Negroes as given to her  
 by her Husband that then in such case I give all the said Negroes to be  
 equally divided between my two Children John and Thomas & Mary & Elizabeth  
 & Rebeca and all what other negroes I have not given already to be equally  
 divided between my said four Children excepting his share of two negroes which I  
 give to my two sons John & Thomas first and above these others and what negroes  
 I have formerly given to my daughters Children I give to them & their wives.  
 Item I give to my son John a negro man named old Jenny & my other Husband  
 and my three Daughters Elizabeth, Mary & Ann old Danas black wife & daughters, Item  
 I give to my son Thomas any negro whom I find among other personable slaves incly  
 negroes which happens to be his and what other wife & children I have not already given I  
 give to be equally divided amongst my said four Children John & Thomas &  
 Mary and Elizabeth & Rebeca. Lastly I nominate & appoint my two Sons John  
 and Thomas Executors to this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I  
 have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of November 1724.
