in the Colony of Virginia being grown old but in perfect Memory thanks be to Almighty God for it do make this my
last will & Testament and first I give my soul to God that gives it and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion
of my wife hereafter named in full & certain hope of a joyfull Resurrection to life everlasting through the Merits &
Mediation of Jesus Christ my Redeemer according to the true faith of a Christian & finally I give my worldly goods
as followeth viz: I give to my Son John the lower part of my land whereon my dwelling house standeth that is from the
Corner at the fork of the Beaver dam branch up to three white oaks standing by the road on the lower side thereof to my plantation &
to along the said Road to a marked ring white oak standing by the road on the lower side thereof to my plantation &
from the said oak along a line of marked trees to the head of a small branch running out of the South-west corner of the
said Beaver dam branch & the bounds between me & Matthew Collins to him & his heirs forever after his maner
I hereby I give to my son John a feather bed bought of John Vawter & the green rugg & blanket & bolster & pillow & a
pair of Sheets & six Shirts of my two quills & my great bible & all my carpenters joiners & Coopers tools & a young
Cow & calf to be delivered to him when he shall come to be eighteen years of age at which time I will that he shall be
for himself & forthwith I give to my Son Samuell all the rest of my land that is above the line of marked trees & the
abovesaid small branch & the abovesaid three & a half white oaks to him & his heirs forever & finally I give to my
Son Samuell my best will puff bed bolster & pillow & the best spotted rag a pair of blankets a pair of Sheets & my

my two Sons when they shall arrive to the age of fourteen years that they have part of them a year & a half being given
them to learn them to write and Cypher & that their Schooling be paid for out of the rest of my estate that is not given
to them & I do hereby I will that after my wife deceaseth all the rest of my estate be equally divided amongst my
said Children my wife being to have her life time in the land & plantation & finally I will that in Case that

either of these my two sons should dye without issue that his part of Land shall fall to the other brother & his heirs for
ever & I hereby do constitute & appoint my loving wife Sarah & my son John my Executor & Administrator to
the my will & estate & for executing all other wills & conditions and writings I do with my own hand & seal sign &
seal this as my last will & Testament in presence of these Witnesses this 15. day of January 1725
