hands of the said Thomas Davis as soon as the said orphan shall attain to Lawfull age or when
hereunto required by the Justices of the peace for the County of Essex as also to save & keep harmless
the said Justices their heirs & Successors from all trouble & damage that shall or may arise about the
said Estate then this obligation to be void or else to be in full force & Virtue
