

In the name of god Amen I John Calcott of the County of Essex and City of London being One and twenty in body but of sound & perfect mind and memory praised be given to Almighty God the same do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following First & principally I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it not leaving through the Meritorious Death and passion of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and to be partaker of the glorious Resurrection through Jesus Christ by the Almighty power of God and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried in Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named And as for my worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth Item I give and bequeath unto my God Daughter Elizabeth Calcott one God ring of the value of Ten Shillings to be paid to her after my decease Item I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife Mary Calcott all the rest of my Estate both real & personal as it in what kind or nature whatsoever to her her heirs & assigns for ever And lastly I do nominate constitute and appoint my Loving wife Mary Calcott my whole & sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament & making void all former wills by me made and I do acknowledge this to be my last Will & Testament & give thereto my hand & seal this ninth day of September 1722.

Know all men by these presents that we Mary Calcott and John Taylor are both & severally bound unto Joseph Smith, William Sampford, Laurence Calhazero & Valaker Massee Justices of the County of Essex in the sum of two hundred pounds shillings to which payment well & truly to be made we have our selves our heirs Executors & Assigns bound jointly & severally to the said Justices their heirs & assigns & assigns by these presents witness our hands & seals this 16<sup>th</sup> day of October 1722.

The Condition of this Obligation is such that if the above bound Mary Calcott Executrix of the said Calcott doth not pay all the debts of the said deceased within two years from the time of the death & as the same are given in the said Will to then this Obligation to be void & of none effect otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.
