made. Imprimis I bequeath my soul to God that gave it me and my body to the earth to be decently
interred. 2^d I give to my Daughter Sarah Taliaferro two hundred pounds Sterling money of
England and one negro Girl named Hannah which is to be paid her at the day of
Marriage or when she is eighteen years of age to her and her heirs for ever. 3^d I give to my
Daughter Elizabeth Taliaferro two hundred pounds Sterling money of England and one Negro
girl named Daphne to be paid her on the day of marriage or when she is eighteen years of age
to her and her heirs for ever. 4^d I give to my daughter Mary Taliaferro two hundred pounds
Sterling money of England and one Negro girl named Phillis to be paid her on the day of marriage
or when she is eighteen years of age to her and her heirs for ever. 5^d I give to my daughter
Alice Taliaferro two hundred pounds Sterling money of England and one Negro Girl named
Sue to be paid her on the day of marriage or when she is eighteen years of age to her and
her heirs for ever, my will is that if either, or any of my aforesaid Daughters die before
they are married or arrive to the age of eighteen years that their their Estates to be equally
divided between the surviving Sisters. 6^d I give to my Son John three hundred and fifty
acres of Land being the back part of seven hundred acres at Mespaponux which I bought
of William Smith. I also give my Son John three hundred and twenty five acres of
Land lying in King George County and the one half of a tract of Land that Nicholas
Christopher lives on at the Mountaines and the one half of another tract of Land lying
at the mountaines that George Hooton & James Reins lives on likewise the half of a tract
of Land lying in the Forrest which I purchased of John Sanders and one Crawford to
him & his heirs for ever. 7^d I give to my Son Francis three hundred and fifty acres of
Land being the riverside part of seven hundred acres of Land at Mespaponux which I
bought of William Smith. I also give to my son Francis the one half of a tract of Land
that Nicholas Christopher lives on at the mountaines and if one half of a nother tract
of Land lying at y^e Mountains that George Hooton & James Reins lives on likewise
the half of a tract of Land lying in the Forrest which I purchased of John Sanders &
one Crawford to him and his heirs for ever. 8^d I give to my son William the plant
ation on which I now dwell and also a tract of Land lying at y^e mountaines taken
up in Copartnership with John Taliaferro where my Quarter is now likewise a tract
of Land lying on the mount swamps that is Between mount John Taliaferro & myself
to him and his heirs forever. I give to my Son William that tract of Land which Fra
Johnson lives on to him and his heirs for ever. I give to my three Sons John Francis &
William all the rest of my negroes to them & their heirs for ever to be equally divided among
them. I give to my daughters Sarah Elizabeth Mary and Alice each of them a feather
bed and boulster. I give to my three Sons John Francis & William all my household good &
stocks whatsoever to be equally divided among them to them & their heirs for ever. my
will is that if either, or any of my Sons should die before they arrive to the age of
twenty one years that their their Estate be equally divided between the Survivors.

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I give all the rest of my estate to be equally divided between my three Sons John Francis & William, to them and their heirs forever my will is that my loving wife Sarah Taliaferro have a maintenance out of my estate during her life my will is that my four daughters have a maintenance out of my estate until they are married lastly I do appoint my three Sons John Francis & William, ex: of this my last will and Testament and I do order and appoint my loving brother, John Taliaferro M^r Francis Thornton jun^d. M^r John Catlett & M^r Anthony Thornton, to supervise and settle all Differences that shall arise at any time between my wife and Children In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this seventh day of May anno Domⁱ 1726.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound John Taliaferro jun^d: Ex: of the last will and Testament of Lawrence Taliaferro Deed do make or cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and Singular the goods chattels and Credits of the said Deed which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said John, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him & the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of Isle at such time as he shall be thereto required by the said Court and the same goods chattels & Credits & all other the goods chattels and Credits of the said Deed at the time of his Death, or which at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the said John, or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly adm^r according to Law and further do make a true and just account of his actings & doings therin when thereto required by the said Court and also do well and truly pay and Deliver all the Legacies contained & specified in the said Testament as far as to the value of the same intended according to the value thereof and the law.
