 taken for my last will & Testament & none other & first I bequeath
 my soul to God that gave it & my body to Earth from whence
 it came to be buried in such decent & Christian manner as to
 my Executor or hereafter named shall be thought meet & convenient

There to rest till the Joyfull Resurrection of the Just trusting through
 the merits of my dear Saviour Jesus Christ for free pardon and for-
 giveness of sins and as for such temporal goods and Estate as the Lord
 has been pleased favor above my deserts to bestow upon me, I do over-
 bestow give bequeath & devise in manner & Manner following viz
 (here over) I give to my daughter Ann Sunstall, two hundred Pounds
 & fifty Sterling. I give to my two daughters Betty & Catherine Hill
 four hundred Pounds Sterling to each of them and it is my desire
 that my two daughters Betty & Catherine Hill to be maintained
 by their Brother Leonard Hill or his heirs till they come to the age
 of eighteen years or married & afterward to be maintained out
 of their portions, by their Brother Leonard Hill. If either of my
 two daughters Betty or Catherine Hill should die before they come
 to the age of eighteen years & not married then the deed & party's
 portion to be equally divided between their Brother Leonard Hill &
 the surviving sister Betty & Catherine Hill I give and bequeath
 to my son Leonard Hill all my lands Plantations Negroes Stock
 plate Cash goods & Merchants things like going or coming on
 the sea to be & his heirs for ever I give and bequeath to my
 Godson John Gorington ten Pounds to buy him a feather bed
 I do appoint my son Leonard Hill to be my sole Executor. This
 is my last will & Testament Revoking all others & it is
 my desire that my Estate may not be appraised As witness
 my hand & Seal this 12th day of May 1728.
