In the name of God Amen I Mary Bagge of St. Andrews parish in  
the County of Essex in the Colony of Virginia widow & relict of John Bagge late deceased being  
of sound mind & memory do make and ordain this to be my last will & Testament touching  
and disposing all or any former will or wills and Testaments by me before made giving  
and bequeathing my soul to Almighty God in hopes of Eternall Salvation through the mediation  
of Jesus Christ my Saviour & my body to its mother Earth to be buried after a Christian like  
manner & as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon me with all I dispose of it as  
followeth .1.<sup>o</sup> It is my will that all my just debts be paid .2.<sup>o</sup> It is my desire that my estate  
be not appraised & I give unto Mr. Eliz<sup>a</sup> Waring wife of Cap<sup>t</sup>: Thomas Waring my  
Chaise and horse called Torrit 4 I give unto Betty Waring eldest daughter of the above  
Thomas Waring & the heirs male of her body lawfully begotten a negro Child named Betty  
being the Jurse of negro Kate the slaves woman & for want of such Lawfull heirs I bequeath  
the said negro and her future increase to my Nephew Edmund Bagge & his heirs forever 5 I give  
unto my Cousin Penelope Manly my side Sables & furniture 6 I give unto my Nephew Edmund Bagge  
and his heirs forever all the residue and Remainder of my estate of what kind or nature soever  
with all rights titles interests claims dues and demands which in any wise have doth or shall hereafter  
appertain or belong to me 7 I constitute make and appoint my said Nephew Edmund Bagge my  
whole and sole Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I sign & seal this  
my last will & Testament this 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1726.
