and disposing all or any former will or wills and Testaments by me before made giving
and bequeathing my soul to Almighty God in hopes of Eternall Salvation through the mediation
of Jesus Christ my Saviour & my body to its mother Earth to be buried after a Christian like
manner & as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me withall I dispose of it as
followeth 1st It is my will that all my just debts be paid 2^d It is my desire that my estate
be not appraised 3 I give unto Mr^r Eliz^a Waring wife of Cap^t Thomas Waring my
Chaise and horse called Torrick 4 I give unto Betty Waring Eldest daughter of the above
Thomas Waring & the heirs male of her body lawfully begotten a negro Child named Betty
being the Increase of negro Kate the House wench & for want of such Lawfull heirs I bequeath
the said negro and her future increase to my Nephew Edmund Bagge & his heirs forever 5 I give
unto my Coz^r Penelope Manly my side Saddle & furniture 6 I give unto my Nephew Edmund Bagge
and his heirs forever all the residue and Remainder of my estate of what kind or nature soever
with all rights likes interests claims dues and demands which in any wise have doth or shall hereafter
appertain or belong to me 7 I constitute make and appoint my said Nephew Edmund Bagge my
whole and sole Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I sign & seal this
my last will & Testament this 20th day of August 1726.

sd Susannah Conduit or into the hands or possession of any other person
or persons for her & the same do make do exhibit or cause to be
exhibited into the County Court of Essex at such time as she shall
be thereunto required by the sd Court and the same goods Chattels &
Credits and all other the goods Chattels & Credits of the sd dec^d at
the time of her death or which at any time after shall come to the
hands or possession of the sd Susannah Conduit or into the hands
or possession of any other person or persons for her do well & truly Adm^r
according to law & further do make a just & true Account of her
Receipts & disburse therein when thereto required by the sd Court & also
do well & truly pay & deliver all the legacies contained & specified in
the sd Testament as far as the sd goods Chattels & Credits will therein
extend according to the Value thereof & the law shall charge Then this
above Obligation to be void & of none Effect otherwise to be & remain
in full force power & virtue
