my gold ring Item I give and bequeath to my daughter  
Anne Halewood my large looking glass Item I give  
and bequeath to my three eldest children Anne Halewood, Cleare  
Halewood, and Richard Halewood my three silver spoons  
Item I give and bequeath to my son Richard Halewood my  
pistols and holsters sword and belt Item I give and bequeath  
to my son Richard Halewood a piece of land joining upon  
Mr. John Brooke's the land that I have in town Brooke  
bound to acknowledge to me or my heirs when demanded to him  
and his heirs for ever Item I bind to my beloved wife Pastham  
Halewood five negroes named Jack, Tim, Wm, Betty, later  
during her natural life and then after her deceas to

 lawfully begotten of their bodies for ever — Item I give and

 body for ever — Item I give and bequeath to my  
 daughter Pasant Gatewood one negro girl named Lupus  
 to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body forever —  
 & Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Gatewood  
 two negroes named Beck & Moll they and their increase to her  
 and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body for ever —  
 Item I give and bequeath to the child yet unborn one  
 negro named Jemmy to that be it boy or girl to it or its  
 heirs lawfully begotten of its body for ever — Item I give  
 and bequeath to my beloved wife Pasant Gatewood one  
 white riding horse and sidesaddel and bridle and whip  
 and the best bed & furniture — Item I give and bequeath  
 to my beloved daughter Ann Gatewood four negroes named  
 Anna, Alice, Grace, and Ben, they and their increase to her  
 and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body for ever —  
 Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Clara  
 Gatewood four negroes named Ned, Harry, Lucy, & one they  
 and their increase to her and her heirs lawfully begotten  
 of her body for ever — Item I give and bequeath to my  
 beloved son Richard Gatewood five negroes named Judy,  
 Tom, Bill, Minnie, & Norah, they and their increase to him  
 and his heirs lawfully begotten of his body for ever, and  
 a feather bed and arug a blanket, & sheet and five head of  
 fattle two cows one mare of five year old two two year old  
 one small one & one large one and five head of hogs —  
 two cows and three barrows and one unbroke mare — Item  
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Gatewood a feather  
 bed, and arug a blanket, & sheet and five head of cattle  
 two cows one mare of five year old, two two year old —  
 and five head of hogs two cows and three barrows —  
 Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Clara Gatewood  
 a feather bed and arug a blanket, & sheet and five head  
 of cattle two cows one mare of seven year old two two year  
 old and five head of hogs two cows and three barrows —  
 Item I give and bequeath to my four youngest children Eliz<sup>a</sup>  
 Gatewood, Pasant Gatewood & Sarah Gatewood and the child  
 yet unborn all the rest of my beds and bedden that is not

before given and likewise my will and desire is that all my  
 fatter and hoggs that it not before given to be equally divided  
 between my wife and her four children & I bind to my beloved  
 wife the land that I now live upon that goes to the roads that  
 lead to the old mill bridge during her natural life and  
 then to return to the next air after the Corp is finished yet  
 is now growing upon it — Item I give unto my beloved  
 wife five pound current money and the rest of my money  
 to be equally divided amongst all my children — Item I  
 give one old silver tankard and a silver spoon and an  
 silver buckle to my beloved wife Pleasant Gatewood — Item  
 my will and desire is that the rest of my estate that I have  
 not yet given away shall be equally divided among my  
 wife and seven children — Item It is my will and desire  
 that David Scott as soon as my will is known and my estate

 Executors of my two daughters Ann Gatewood and Clara

 constitute my beloved wife Pleasant Gatewood and David  
 Scott to be Executors of her part and her four children  
 part Elizabeth Gatewood and Pleasant Gatewood and Anna  
 Gatewood and one that is unborn of this my last will and  
 Testament revoking and disannulling all other wills  
 and Testaments before made by me duly ifc<sup>o</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> 1730 as
