I give and bequeath unto Betty Moor one negro man named Sam. Item I give 340 acres of Land Thos Rich Mary Sarah equally to be divided Item I give one negro boy to John Ward Son to Mary Ward my Pistols holsters and sword to be delivered to his mother I give unto Thomas Bone my horse

bridle and Saddle two Cows and yearlings and all my wearing cloas viz home hoggs 3 barrel of Indian Corn, Item to Thomas Moor one Cow 3 hiffers 5 Young hoggs 2 1/2 bar. corn Item to William Bone 2 yearlings and a young bear 5 hoggs with my math 2 1/2 bar. corn, Item I give unto Mary Ward 17 1/2 pounds of tobacco which is in a hogshod in the tobacco house a gth Tankard 1 bar. of Indian Corn 50 wth of m. To Tho^l Bone 2 dishes 3 plates a Couch and piott the biggest To Tho Moor a Chest To Will Bone a Case of drawers The fadder to be divided amongst 3 broth The remainder to be divided of the meat Tho Moor my great frying pan one dish 2 plates and podinger, Will^m Bone one iron pot about 17 pounds of feathers to my sister one feather bed with the furniture belonging to it To Mary Ward one bed with furniture belonging to it To Tho Moor one Candlestick 1 frying pan 5 Chairs 1 dozⁿ of spoons 1 paper box To Will^m Bone 4 fuggs To Thomas Moor 1 pot of hoggs lard 3 bushels of wheat
