Case she should die before she comes of age & if it is my will it shall return to the Survivor. 5 I will and bequeave to my Loving wife one little Gray horse and all the rest of my movables to her own disposall and one Cask of Sider 6 It is my will that my loving wife & my loving son shall be my Ex^{ors} of this my last will and Testament Lastly I constitute and asanull all former wills made by me to be void and of none Effect as with my hand and Seal this fifth. day of November 1725.
