 well and truly to be made we bind our selves our heirs &c. and adm^rs jointly &
 severally to the said Justices their heirs and Successors firmly by these presents
 with our hands and Seals this 16 day of Aug^r 1726.

The Condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Francis
 Slaughter &c. of this last will and Testament of Robert Slaughter deceased do make or
 cause to be made a true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods Chattels &
 Credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge
 of the said Robert or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for
 him & the same Inventory do exhibit or cause to be exhibited into the County Court of
 Essex at such time as he shall be thereto required by the said Court & the same goods
 Chattels and Credits & all other the goods Chattels & Credits of the said deceased at the time
 of his death or within at any time after shall come to the hands or possession of the
 said Robert or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him
 do well and truly adm^r according to Law & further do make a true and just account of
 his affairs & doings therein when thereto required by the said Court & also do well & truly
