

In y. name of gode Amen I Samuel Sallis of s<sup>t</sup> And parish in the County of Essex being very sick and weak but of perfect sense and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same and calling to mind y<sup>e</sup> frailty of Mortality that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and Testament making void all other wills before by me made Inprimis I give my Soul to the Almighty God that gave it and my body to the Earth to be buried Christian like at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as for what estate it hath pleased God to bestow on me in this world I give and bequeath in y<sup>e</sup> manner and forme as followeth Item I give to my half brother Samuel Shost a New kersey Coat, and adrogatt Vest and breeches - Item I give to my Cousen Samuel Tallisano my Young breeding mare - Lastly I give and bequeath the remainer part of my Estate <sup>being equally divided</sup> both real, & personall to my two Sisters Ann Ayres and Sarah Touchett (to them and their heirs for ever) whom I appoint Executors & ordaine my Executors of this my last will and Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and fixed my Seal this sixteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Twenty five
