 equally divided between my five Children John and Thomas & Mary & Elizabeth
 & Rebecca and all what other negroes I have not given already to be equally
 divided between my said five Children excepting the share of two negroes which I
 give to my two Sons John & Thomas due and above their shares and what negroes
 I have formerly given to my aforesaid Children I give to them & their heirs,
 When I give to my Son John a negro man called Joe Jemmy & my eldest daughter
 and my eldest Son John & all the Land I have in the Parish of St. James & Martins, then
 I give to my Son Thomas my share When I give all my other personal estate money
 & lands & such negroes & other things I have not already given I
 give to be equally divided amongst my said five Children John & Thomas &
 Mary and Elizabeth & Rebecca. Lastly I nominate & appoint my two Sons John

 & memory thanks be to god for it do make this my Last Will & Testament
 in manner & form following viz. First I give my Soul to god that gave it.

and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors after named in hope of
the pardon of my Sins by the merits death & passion of my Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ
according to the true faith of a Christian. Secondly as to my worldly goods I give as followeth
First I give to my Son being my Son Daniel Triplet my Dwelling plantation & all the lands
belonging to it to him and his heirs for ever. Thirdly I give to my God Daughter Jean Doust
my under and side lands to her and her heirs. Fourthly I give to Jean Landrum my young
man and if I should die in a short time that is before she is married, will that she shall
live upon my plantation as long as she lives a single life and that she shall have a
Maintenance found her out of the Estate. Fifthly I will that whereas I have agreed with
Robert Anyan to be my Executor to look after my plantation this ensuing year to make a
Crop I will that in case I should die before the year is ended that the slaves should remain
under his care till the Crop is finished & that nothing that is now on the plantation
shall be removed till the Crop is finished. Sixthly I will that all the rest of my estate except
my wearing clothes & my two husbands wearing clothes, be equally divided between my
daughters and sons that is to say all my real & personal estate except what I have
already given I give to be equally divided between John Miller & William Triplet &
Jean Miller & Abner Ellison & their heirs that is to say all my Negroes, goods,
furniture, household goods, horses, sheep, hogs, money, Tobacco, Corn, Wheat & such kind
are due to me, I will that after my debts are paid that they all be equally divided
between John Miller & William Triplet & Jean Miller & Abner Ellison as
abovesaid & their heirs. Seventhly & lastly I ordain & appoint my two
brothers John Miller & William Triplet my Executors to this my last Will & Testament
In witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and seal this 24th day of November 1724
