Inprimis I Command my Soul into the hands of almighty god my maker hoping through the Meritorious death & passion of Iesus Christ our Saviour & Redeemer to receive free pardon of all my sins & a joyfull resurrection at the last day and as for my body I give it to my Collector the Earth to be discreetly buried at the discretion of the Executors or Executor hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate that god wille best me after my just debts & funeral Charges paid I dispose of in form & manner following. Item I give & bequeath to James Gatewood ten pounds current money of Virginia. Item I give unto John Gatewood five pounds of like money of Virginia. Item I give Philip Gatewood the son of John Gatewood my mare & her increase to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give James Gatewood eight hundred pounds of Tobacco. Item I give David Stott five hundred pounds of Tobacco. Item I give James Gatewood twenty yards of Corncripp. Item I give John Gatewood six hundred yards of Corncripp. Item I give James Gatewood thirty shillings that David Barrett owes to me. Item I give & bequeath to James Gatewood all my Run that is in my nest only letting David Stott have one fettle of the Run. Item I give to James Gatewood all & every part & parcel of my Estate that I have not given away in Legacy. Item I do hereby disavow make void and annul all former Wills & Testaments Legacies & bequest by me heretofore or at any time willed made given & bequeathed & do publish this to be my last will & Testament making my friend James Gatewood my sole Executor & of this my Last Will & Testament I have made three true & correct Copies & assigned my Seal thereto as before mentioned.
