and her increase Item I give and bequeath to Gilbert Beuden my
large Coates & jacket Item it is my will that if my Negro woman
Hannah should have any more children I give this sum to Mary
Webster and the rest to Richard Jones and the rest to John Jones —
and the rest to Richard Jones and the rest to Walter Jones and
the rest to William Jones to them and their heirs Item I leave
all the remaining part of my Estate be it of what nature so
ever to my loving wife Elizabeth silly during her natural
life and after her decease it is my will that it shall be equally
divided between Mary Webster, Francis Jones, John Jones, Walter
Jones, Richard Jones & William Jones to them and their heirs and
I do make and ordain my beloved wife Elizabeth silly whole & sole
Executor to this my last will and testament utterly revoking —
and denying all other will or wills heretofore made by me in
this place whereof I have herein unto setting my hand and fixing my
seale this Twenty third day of October one thousand seven
hundred and Twenty Nine —
