 and forme as followeth VIZ^t First of all I recommend my soule into the
 hands of Almighty God who gave it and not doubting but thro the
 Merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to receive pardon, and Remission
 for all my past sins and a joyfull resurrection at — day of Judgement
 with the just & Day of God and as for my body I recommend to the Earth

From whence it was taken to be Christianly buried by my Executors &
 hereafter named and what worldly Estate it hath please God to bestow on &
 Me in this Life I give & bequeath after my Just debts paid as followeth.
 Viz^t Imp^t I give unto my Son William Hudson one Shilling Ster^t &
 Item it is my will & desire that my loving wife Elizth Hudson have the
 use of ^{the} One third part of my land and plantation where I now dwell with
 the house during her Natural life Item I give & bequeath unto my
 Son John Hudson & my daughter Elizabeth Hudson equally to be divided
 betwixt them & the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten for Ever my land
 and plantation where I now dwell on Sweataway Creek and in case &
 that either my son John or my daughter Elizth should dye without
 such heirs that then the Land & plantation shall descend to the
 survivor and the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten for Ever &
 that it shall not be sold, leased mortgaged nor rented by them nor any
 person whatsoever and further that if my Daughter Elizth Hudson
 shall marry a man that land of his Owne that then my son John
 shall have the whole tract of land for the life of him and the heirs
 of his body lawfully begotten for ever and all my wearing cloths give
 unto my son John Item it is my will, and desire that all the rest of
 my Estate be it of what nature or quality soever be for the use of
 my wife Elizth Hudson, my son John Hudson, and my daughter
 Elizth Hudson, and further I desire that my son and daughter live
 with their Mother during her life and then the whole personal Estate
 be equally divided betwixt my said ^{son} John, & Elizabeth and their heirs
 for Ever and that my horses, & mares be kept for the use of the planta-
 tion And Lastly I constitute Ordain, and Appoint my sons John
 Hudson and my daughter Elizth Hudson to be my whole & sole Executors
 of this my last will & testam^t and I do hereby revoke all other & former wills by
 me made to what power In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 & Seal this 5th day of May 1729 -
