it doth make me Ordaine this to be my last will & testament in Manner
and forme as followeth Viz^e I trust of all I recommend my soule into the
hands of Almighty God who gave it and not doubting but thro the Mer-
ties of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to receive pardon and remission
for all my past sinnes and a joyfull resurrection at — day of judgement
with the just & true judgment of God and as for my body I recommend to the Earth.

From whence it was taken to be Christianly Buried by my Executor &
hereafter named and what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow on
Me in His Life I give & bequeath after my just debts paid as followeth -
Vizt I imp^d I give unto my son William Hudson one Shilling Sterl &
Item it is my will & desire that my loving wife Eliz^r Hudson have the
use of One third part of my land and plantation where I now dwell with
the houses during her natural life Item I give & bequeath unto my
son John Hudson & my daughter Elizabeth Hudson equally to be divided
between them & the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten for ever my land
and plantation here I now dwell on Piscataway Creek and in case &
that either my son John or my daughter Eliz^r should dye without
such heirs that then the Land & plantation shall descend to the
survivor and the heirs of their bodies lawfully begotten for ever &
that it shall not be sold, leased, mortgaged nor rented by them nor any
person whatsoever and further that if my daughter Eliz^r Hudson
shall marry a man that land of his ownes that then my son John to
shall have the whole tract of land for the use of him and the heirs
of his body lawfully begotten for ever and all my wearing clothes goes
unto my son John Item it is my will, and desire that all the rest of
my Estate be it of what nature or quality soever be for the use of
my wife Eliz^r Hudson, my son John Hudson, and my daughter
Eliz^r Hudson, and further I desire that my son and daughter live
with their Mother during her life and then the whole personal Estate
be equally divided betwixt my said John, & Elizabeth and their heirs
for ever and that my horses, & Mares be kept for the use of the planta-
tion And Lastly I constitute Ordain, and Appoint my son John
Hudson and my daughter Eliz^r Hudson to be my whole & sole Execut^r
