that shall be at settlement which settlement shall be made
as soon as can be conveniently laid out in land as conveni-
ent to my said whereon I now live as may be, and in
horses, cattle and sheep discretionary to my Order
I then I send unto my beloved wife Elizabeth during her
natural life all the Rest of my Estate Real and personal
and after her decease I give to be equally divided amongst
all my Children: Richard, Anne, John, William, Elizabeth,
Thomas, Abraham, and Philip to them and their Heirs or
Representatives for ever.
