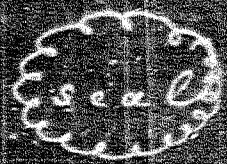


In the name of God amen I Betty Ramsay of Tappahannock being of sound

 of the said Negroes to return to my Daughters Betty and Molly Ramsay
 to be equally divided between them and their Heirs forever And to this
 my last will and Testament do appoint my brother James Townley and
