and Samuel Croft to John Sale and Elizabeth his Wife
during their lives and after their Decease I Give the Land
and Plantation I now live on Together with the Land I

Daughter of Mark Davis to James Sale son of the said John and
Elizabeth to him and his heirs forever. Item I give all the Remainder
my land to Robert Sale son of the said John and Elizabeth to
him and his heirs forever. Item I give to William Sale son of
William Sale one Negro Girl named Selah and my young
sonne James to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to be
Equally Divided among the children of Robert Sale Decd
son of my brother William the following Negroes, Milly, Moll
and her child they and their Increase to them and their heirs
forever. Item I give unto Thomas a wherthy negro Woman
named Alice and her child to him and his heirs forever. Item
I lend unto John Sale and Elizabeth his Wife the following
Negroes known by the names of Dick, Peter, Mary, Rose, Philip
Ed, Billy, James, Zachary, Rachel, Davy, Sam they and
their Increase, and after their Decease I give them to be Equally
Divided among the children of the said John and Elizabeth
to them and their heirs forever. Item I give to my Nephew Arthur

and one boy named Edmund and one of my
Hares and a cow and a calf to him and his heirs forever
IEM I bequeath to James Upshaw and Luca his Wife Negroes
known by the Names of Isaac, Sary, Jesse, and Jacob they and
their Increase and after their Decease I give them to be equally
divided among the Children of the said James Upshaw
that hath by his said Wife Luca to them and their heirs forever
IEM I give all the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided
between the above named John Sale and the above named
William Sale son to William Sale to them and their heirs
forever. And Lastly I appoint my Friends James Upshaw and
Thomas Mueschly Executors to this my last Will and Testament
Given under my hand and Seal this 3^d day of October 1772.
