as also Eleven pounds Current money to be taken out of the other
of my aforesaid negroes and my Will is further that all and
every other of my said Negroes besides the negro boy Wyatt and
the eleven Pounds taken out that they and their Increase should
be equally divided amongst my other Children namely Sarah

Betty Margaret, and Molly to them and their heirs forever
I constitute and appoint my two sons Caleb and Mark Boulware
to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament In testimony

and I hereby give the said negro girl Pegg and her increase to my daughter
Molly to her and her heirs forever and my Will is that if either
my children die before they come to Lawful age or marriage that
their parts should be equally divided amongst the survivors of my
Children, in Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this day and Year above written
