I Francis Brizendine of Southwark in the County of Surrey being sick and much of time, but of sound and perfect memory present to myself in the name of God that I should properly make this my last will and Testament in form and manner following, first and principally I Bequeath my Soul to God that governeth and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned And my worldly Estate to which both pleased God I bestow on me, I give and sell with, Virtue Item, I Leave to my Loving Wife Elizabeth Brizendine during her natural life or Widowhood all my whole Estate both Real and Personal, and after her death, I give and sell with the Item I give and bequeath to my son Francis Brizendine the tract of Land that formerly belonged to Daniel Dalgarno and to his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my true sons Thomas Brizendine and Alexander Brizendine my Land that belonged to The City of London, and the Land that I purchased of James Gouval, and Thomas Cooper whenever a piece of Land purchased of Wm Cheaney, to be equally divided between my three sons. I also bequeath and give to my three sons

of James Daniel, and Thomas Cooper whenever a piece of
purchase of W^m Cheaney, to be equally divided? Between my
two and their heirs for ever, and if either of them should
die without their Lawfully begotten, then part of said land to
the other, and if they both should die without their Lawfully begotten
Then to my Son Annoted Paviniana and her heirs.

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Annoted Paviniana all my
Tract of Land whereon I now live, and to his heirs Lawfully
begotten for ever And if he should die without such Lawful
heirs then to be equally divided Between Thomas Paviniana
And Randolph Paviniana my sons. And further in my
will and devise that my Daughter Paviniana Paviniana shall
live without interruption at my place whereon I now live so
long as she shall live single.

Item, I give unto my Son Francis Paviniana my negro
maid a part unto his heirs forever. Turn over

Item, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Paviniana my
negro woman called Jane, and one Feather Bed & furniture now
to his heirs forever. And if he should die without his Lawfully

hair then to be equally divided between them
And Randolph Brien and my son. And further is my
will and desire that my Daughter Susanna Brien shall
live without interruption at my place where ever I now live as
long as she shall live single.

Item I give unto my son Francis Brien and my negro boy
named Pip and to his heirs forever. Furmore,

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Brien and my
negro woman called Fannie, and one feather bed and furniture and
to his heirs forever, if the said son die without being lawfully
begotten then to my two sons Randolph, by and bequeathed unto to

his heirs. Item I give and bequeath to my son Randolph
Brien and my negro girl named Pil of one feather bed and
furniture and to his heirs lawfully begotten and in default of
such heir to be divided between my two sons Thomas and
Randolph and their heirs.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Brien and my
negro man Joe and my negro boy Solomon and one feather bed and

Bed and furniture and to his heirs lawfully begotten and for want of issue
him to be divided between my two Sons Thomas & Randolph.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Prudden my negro boy Jacob
and to his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susanna Prudden my negro
girl Peggy and one featherbed and curtains and if she should die without
issue lawfully begotten to my be equally divided between my three Sons
Viz. Thomas, Randolph, & Amos and to their heirs.

Item, I give and bequeath to my Daughter in Law Sarah Chancy Townsend
Cash, and if she should die without issue, to be divided amongst all my
Children further, my will and desire is that after the Death of my
Wife my negro fellow named Arthur, and all the remainder of my
personal Estate not yet mentioned be equally divided amongst all my
Children, the said fellow not to be sold out of the Family.

Lastly, I appoint my living Wife Elizabeth Prudden and my son
Thomas Prudden my heirs and the heirs of their bodies to this my last will
and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
